IMPORT REQUIREMENTS OF IVORY COAST FOR BOVINE  
EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate (VS Form 17-140) issued by a veterinarian so authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and consignee, and complete identification of the animals to be exported. Additional information shall include:

CERTIFICATION STATEMENT:

1. The United States is free of foot-and-mouth disease.

TEST RESULTS:

1. Brucellosis standard tube test negative 1:50.
2. Tuberculosis caudal intradermal test mammalian PPD negative.
3. Bovine leucosis AGID test negative.
4. Paratuberculosis caudal intradermal test negative.
5. Negative culture genital swab for vibriosis and trichomoniasis.
6. Anaplasmosis CF test negative.

EMBARKATION STATEMENT:

At the port of embarkation, a VS port veterinarian shall attach to the Origin Health Certificate the "Certificate of Inspection of Export Animals" (VS Form 17-37) showing:

- (a) The name and address of the consignor.
- (b) The name and address of the consignee.
- (c) The number and species of animals to be shipped.
- (d) A statement that the animals "have been given a careful veterinary inspection at the port of embarkation and found to be free from evidence of communicable disease and exposure thereto" (within 24 hours of exportation).
