PY 2003 WIA Summary Report —Dislocated Workers (Derived from PY 2003 WIASRD Records)

The following guidelines should be used when reviewing the Dislocated Worker summary report:

- The first section of the summary is the only section where raw numbers of exiters are provided; all other sections provide percentages.
- Users are cautioned to note that the reported percentages are based on the valid information that was submitted by states. Some characteristic and outcome data is missing from the file because not all data elements are required for all exiters, nor are all data elements correctly submitted. Therefore, if one calculates the raw number of individuals with a given characteristic by using the percentage provided and the total number of exiters, one must make the assumption that the missing information, if provided, would have been provided in the same proportions to the valid information.
- The categories of Core Services Only, Intensive Services/No Training, and Training Services are exclusive and add up to the "all exiters" column. Users are reminded that while the exiter counts are additive, the percentages are not. The information in the WPRS Referral column is taken from across the service-level categories.
- The section on outcomes represents a different cohort of exiters than the characteristic data so that a full year of outcomes can be reported. Additionally, because not all exiters are included in the performance measures per exclusions that are part of the definitions of these measures, users should not calculate the raw number of individuals who achieved these outcomes from the exiter counts.
