Overview: FISMA assigns the Chief Information Officer responsibility for "...training and overseeing personnel with significant responsibilities for information security ..." (H. R. 2458—52 (3) D). One of the first steps in designing a role-based training program is to "identify your audience" – for this you will need to identify who within your organization has significant responsibilities for information security.
