#### **Selected Indicators**

This fact sheet presents recent employment and unemployment figures for the New Haven, CT Metropolitan Statistical Area, the state of Connecticut, and the United States. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures price changes or inflation for particular commodities and services at the retail level. The Producer Price Index (PPI) measures price changes or inflation for particular commodities and services at the wholesale level and is widely used by business firms as an escalator in long-term contracts. The Employment Cost Index (ECI) measures price changes or inflation of labor costs which includes wages and salaries and employer costs for employee benefits.


