Public Health-Seattle & King County Influenza Surveillance Long Term Care Facility Outbreak Report

An influenza outbreak should be suspected whenever 10 percent of the resident population becomes ill with a febrile, respiratory disease consistent with influenza, or when three cases of influenza-like illness occur on the same unit within 48-72 hours, with at least one resident having been confirmed to have influenza A. Health care facilities in Washington are required by law to report outbreaks and suspected outbreaks of disease to Public Health (WAC 246-100-076).
