ADVANCED COLPOSCOPY

and Refresher Workshop

This two and a half (21/2) day workshop will bring together a superb faculty of nationally known experts in colposcopy and lower genital tract disease to provide a review and update of colposcopy, vulvar and vaginal disease, and human papilloma-virus. The program is targeted towards IHS and tribal physicians, certified nurse midwifes, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants. The course is designed for providers who do colposcopy or who are in a colposcopy preceptorship. It's an ideal review for the ASCCP Mentorship Exam. The curriculum will enhance colposcopic skills and augment the understanding of management of lower genital tract disease for novice and experienced colposcopists alike. The format includes:

- Lectures
- ♦ Case management discussions
- ♦ Small group slide review sessions

- to enhance colposcopic skills and lesion identification, including CIN and invasive cancer,
- to use evidence-based national guidelines to manage women with abnormal cervical cytology results and/or findings of dysplasia on biopsy,
- to more effectively evaluate and manage VIN and VAIN,
- to recognize and manage benign vulvar dermatoses,
- to understand the mechanisms of malignant transformation of HPV and the effects of HPV on the HIV+ patient,

ASCCP Colposcopy Exam for IHS and tribal colposcopists

At course conclusion (April 1st), a Colposcopy Mentorship Program Exam sponsored by the ASCCP will be offered. Participation is open to those who have completed an ASCCP-approved mentorship or learned colposcopy in a residency that included at least 25 supervised exams with at least 3 high grade lesions. Many participants in the IHS Colposcopy Preceptorship will qualify to take the exam. If you're unsure if your preceptorship qualifies, contact Roberta Paisano. The exam is an evaluation of basic colposcopic competence through multiple choice questions testing cognitive knowledge and slide-based questions of colposcopic findings and diagnosis. Upon achieving a passing grade and submitting documentation of completion of an approved preceptorship, the colposcopist will be awarded a certificate of completion of ASCCP-approved training.

Why take the test?

- Self Assessment.
- Recognition by national colposcopy society.
- Those completing the IHS Colposcopy Program and passing the test will be recommended for unrestricted colposcopy privileges at their IHS or tribal facility.
- Those who pass and complete preceptorship of at least 25 exams, with three or more high grade, may serve as mentors in the ASCCP Mentorship Program. Those who wish to be IHS preceptors are encouraged to participate.
- Those who complete the ASCCP sponsored Mentorship Program (requires 25 supervised exams) and pass the test will supercede the IHS requirement of 50 supervised colpo exams.

Does the test cost extra?

The exam costs \$125, but the IHS Division of Epidemiology will pay this cost for IHS colposcopists and course participants. Please note that this is different from the cost of tuition for the Refresher workshop.
