Several secondary roads in the northern part of the county were temporarily closed due to excessive standing and ponding of water. **Mobile County Grand Bay** 11 0620CST 8K Thunderstorm Wind (G55) 0627CST High winds from a thunderstorm blew trees and power lines down near Grand Bay. **Mobile County** (Mob)Mobile Bates Fl 0640CST 2.5 75 20K Tornado (F0) 0650CST An F0 tornado first touched down in southwest Mobile county about 8 miles southwest of the Mobile Regional Airport. The initial touchdown was near Jeff Hamilton Road, just to the east of Newman Road. The weak tornado moved across open fields and forest, moving across Newman Road near the Branson subdivision. The tornado then moved through the subdivision, blowing down several trees. Some homes were damaged as a result of the fallen trees, while other homes suffered roof damage due to the high winds. The tornado then moved north and crossed Airport Boulevard just west of Newman Road. More trees were blown down here, and several more homes suffered damage, mainly to roofs, from either fallen trees or high winds. The tornado then lifted back into the cloud, about 5 miles southwest of the Mobile Airport. The line of thunderstorms that produced the tornado was associated with the remnants of Tropical Storm Allison, which were moving east across the region.

High winds from a mesocyclone blew down several trees with some landing on roofs of homes and automobiles. The high winds

The damage area was about a mile wide. **Washington County** 4 S Deer Park to 11 8K Thunderstorm Wind (G55) 3 S Deer Park Trees and power lines were blown down by high thunderstorm winds along U. S. Highway 45 south of Deer Park. ALZ063>064 Lower Mobile - Lower Baldwin 0930CST 10K High Wind (G45) 1230CST High gradient winds caused by a strong area of high pressure off the east coast and the remnants of Allison caused some minor damage across the coastal sections of Baldwin and Mobile counties. Sustained wind speeds of 30 to 45 mph with higher gusts were measured at several locations between 930 am and 1230 pm. Some minor damage occurred with small tree limbs blown down and power lines also blown down. ALZ063>064 Lower Mobile - Lower Baldwin 1015CST 3K 11 Coastal Flooding A strong ridge of high pressure off the east coast combined with the remains of Allison caused a tight pressure gradient along the coastal areas of Alabama. Strong southerly winds caused minor coastal flooding over the west end of Dauphin Island and forced the closure of Shell Belt Road in Bayou La Batre. The Causeway across Mobile Bay also had water across the eastbound lanes. Alabama Highway 182 between Gulf Shores and Orange Beach had water in the eastbound lanes of the highway. **Covington County** Libertyville 1705CST 1720CST 3.5 15K Tornado (F0) An F0 tornado first touched down on State Road 55 several miles south of Libertyville, near the Stanley community. Six homes, and a church sustained some minor roof damage, and two outbuildings were also damaged. The tornado tracked northeast, crossing County Roads 32 and 34, and passing just east of the New Shady Grove Church. Trees were blown down at these locations. The tornado then lifted back into the cloud just north of County Road 34. **Covington County** 14 NE Red Level to 1940CST **Funnel Cloud 15 NE Red Level** 1950CST **Crenshaw County** 4 NW Dozier 11 1940CST 0 Funnel Cloud Several funnel clouds were reported along County Road 37 near the border of Covington and Crenshaw counties. The funnel clouds never touched down and most of the sightings were near Mayberry Gully. **Crenshaw County** Luverne Flash Flood Several roads in the south part of the town of Luverne became impassable due to standing water resulting from heavy rain. The roads were closed for a couple of hours until the waters receded.
The very heavy rainfall occurred as the remnants of Tropical Storm Allison moved east across the area. **Washington County** Chatom **5K** Thunderstorm Wind (G55)

Trees and power lines were blown down in and around Chatom as a thunderstorm moved through the county.
