September 1996 Path Length (Miles) Time Local/ Path Number of Estimated Damage Width Persons ALABAMA, North Central Tuscaloosa County 1730CST 0 0 10K 0 Tuscaloosa 02 Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Thunderstorm wind was responsible for downing some trees and power lines in Tuscaloosa leaving more than 5,000 customers without power. **Tuscaloosa County** Tuscaloosa 02 1730CST 30K 0 Flash Flood 1830CST A thunderstorm dropped heavy rain on downtown Tuscaloosa causing flash flooding with water getting in to at least four businesses. Lee County 20K Auburn 09 2000CST 0 Lightning Lightning struck a house damaging the roof and attic. **Lamar County** 3 N Sulligent 2K 2KThunderstorm Wind (G50) Several trees were downed by wind north of Sulligent on County Road 35 in the northern part of Lamar County. Winston County 7 S Haleyville 0649CST 5K 2K16 Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Several trees were damaged or downed in the Glen Mary area of western Winston County. **Morgan County** 1K 7 W Falkville 5K Thunderstorm Wind (G50) A few trees were blown down near Massey in the western part of the county. **Winston County** 8 NW Addison to 7 NW Addison 16 45K 12K Tornado (F1) A small tornado touched down northwest of Addison at the Moreland community. A couple of chicken houses were damaged along with a couple of houses. The tornado initially began in a heavily wooded area where there was near total destruction of the forest. However, an aerial survey showed that the tornado weakened very rapidly and was short-lived. Winston County 4 N Addison to 6 NNE Addison 20K 10K 16 Tornado (F0) A second tornado occurred north of Addison in extreme northeastern Winston County in the Upshaw community. Damage was primarily to trees, however, several buildings sustained minor damage **Madison County** Huntsville 0730CST 25K 16 0 Thunderstorm Wind Two small planes were blown over and suffered extensive damage. Three other small planes sustained minor damage at the Huntsville International airport. **Cullman County** 4 W Fairview 16 0740CST 0 15K 3K Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Numerous trees and power outages were reported in the Simcoe and Gold Ridge areas in the eastern part of the county. Damage was also reported to a shed in Gold Ridge. **Marshall County** 8 SW Grant 16 35K 5K Thunderstorm Wind (G55) Trees were downed along Old Highway 431 in hebron in the northern part of the county. A porch was damaged, a barn was destroyed, and a roof of a house was severely damaged. **Jackson County** Scottsboro 16 0935CST 0 5K 0 Thunderstorm Wind (G50)

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September 1996 Path Length (Miles) Time Local/ Path Width Number of Estimated Persons Damage ALABAMA, North Central **Blount County** 5 E Oneonta 1625CST 0 0 16 5K 0 Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Two trees were reported down in the eastern part of the county. **Marshall County** 1630CST 8**K** Boaz 16 1K Thunderstorm Wind (G50) A few trees and power lines were downed in the southeastern part of the county around Boaz. **Dekalb County** 0 Geraldine 8K 1K Thunderstorm Wind (G50) A few large trees were down between Geraldine and Whiton in the southwestern part of the county. **Blount County** Oneonta 16 1645CST 5K 1K Hail (0.75) Dime size hail was reported at Oneonta. **Blount County** Oneonta 40K Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Wind damaged a roof on a school in Oneonta and a children's recreation area. Trees were reported down in scattered areas across Blount County. **Elmore County** 4 NW Jordan Lake Res. 16 1723CST 0 **Funnel Cloud** A funnel cloud was reported in Lightwood in the northwestern part of Elmore County. **Dallas County** 19 S Selma 16 10K 2K Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Trees were reported down at the intersection of Highway 41 and Highway 89 in southern Dallas County. **Blount County** 1925CST Oneonta 16 75K 0 Lightning A house was struck by lightning and totally destroyed. Cleburne County 2 S Heflin to 3 SSE Heflin 1954CST 1958CST 45K Tornado (F0) What was believed to be a small tornado occurred just south and southeast of Heflin. The weak tornado left a narrow path of downed trees and power lines and took the roofs off several mobile homes. The tornado also downed trees, one of which fell on a vehicle and a mobile home, at Glasgow's Trailer Park near the intersection of I-20 and Alabama 9. Additional damage occurred along Perryman Bridge Road and Evans Bridge Road. Lee County 3 NE Opelika Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Trees were downed at the intersection of Interstate 85 and U. S. 29 in the northern part of the county. **Lauderdale County** 3 E Killen 27 0450CST 15K 2K Thunderstorm Wind (G50) Trees were blown down including one onto a house in Center Star in the southwestern part of the county. **Marshall County** 2.5 SSE Grant to 3 E Grant 0050CST 0056CST 28 2.5 300K 50K Tornado (F2) Around 1:50 am CDT a small but briefly strong tornado struck in northern Marshall County just southeast and east of Grant. The

Around 1:50 am CDT a small but briefly strong tornado struck in northern Marshall County just southeast and east of Grant. The tornado path began about 2.5 miles south-southeast of Grant just off County Road 503 and extended in a northeastward direction for 2.5 miles. The damage path ended 3 miles east of Grant and just south of County Road 34. Total path length was 2.5 miles. Marshall County Emergency Management Agency reported that four houses were destroyed and five homes and four house trailers sustained damage. Six greenhouses were also totally wrecked. Fortunately, many of the destroyed houses were unoccupied at the
