Emergency Preparedness for Child Care Providers: Excellence Award Series

This class is designed for both child care center providers and family child care home providers. The City of Bellevue Fire Department and Public Health – Seattle & King County have joined together to provide a series of 4 classes designed to help child care providers develop a comprehensive disaster plan. The series will teach child care providers how to plan for taking care of children and staff for an extended time due to severe weather or a disaster. Topics will include: writing the emergency plan, maximizing staff for effective emergency response, what and how much supplies you need, educating and recruiting parent volunteers, parent/child reunion, and effective drills. Participants will leave with sample forms and an organizational plan for response.

Participants completing the program and homework assignments will be eligible to apply for the "Excellence Award for Child Care Programs."

Each class is \$16 and earns 2.5 STARS credits. The series of 4 classes is \$64 and offers 10 STARS credits. It is recommended that you attend all of the classes (a program must have at least 1 staff person at each class in order to be eligible for the Excellence Award).

Access to Baby and Child Dentistry (ABCD)

The ABCD Dental Program focuses on preventive and restorative dental care for children from birth through age six. ABCD will help families connect to local dentists who will provide children with many dental services, including an easy exam with the child in their parent's arms (not in a dental chair). The program gives children a great start in life by making sure all baby teeth are healthy, getting children into the dentist as early as age one, and preventing tooth pain later on in life.

To be eligible for the ABCD program a child must be:

- Age birth to 6 years old,
- Live in King County, and
- Have Medicaid medical coupons.

The ABCD Dental Program is a partnership between Public Health – Seattle & King County, King County Health Action Plan, Seattle King County Dental Society, University of Washington, the Washington Dental Service Foundation and the Medical Assistance Administration (MAA).

Nutrition and Food

Cooks representing a cross-section of cultural groups came together in October to share some of their favorite recipes. We are highlighting two of these recipes in our newsletter this month in a new "Nutrition and Food" column. Food is a wonderful way to expose children to information about different cultures and can lead to interesting and educational discussions with children at meal time. Please use these recipes to celebrate the rich cultural heritages our families and children bring to the child care world.

Chicken Fajitas (Sea Mar Child Development Center)

- 1 lb, 10 oz Boneless, skinless chicken breasts cut into 1x2 inch strips
- 1 ½ Tablespoons vegetable oil
- ½ Package of Lawry's Taco Seasoning
- 2 Green bell peppers seeded and julienned
- 2 Medium onions peeled and thinly sliced
- 10 Large flour tortillas warmed

Heat large skillet over medium-high heat. Brown chicken strips in oil until no longer pink, about 4 minutes. Stir in taco seasoning. Add pepper and onion and cook, stirring occasionally, 3-4 minutes until vegetables are tender-crisp. Spoon fajita filling into warmed tortillas. Roll up and serve hot. Serves 10.

Soy Sauce Chicken (Refugee Women's Alliance Preschool)

- 2 lbs chicken wings
- 1 cup soy sauce
- 1 cup water
- 5 pieces star anise
- 4 slices ginger root
- 1 tablespoon sugar

Rinse the chicken wings and put in pot. Add remaining ingredients and cook on stovetop over medium hot heat for 30 minutes.





How Can I Protect Myself Against the Flu?

It is not possible to predict how severe the influenza season will be this year. With a shortage of vaccine, it is possible that some people will get the flu who would have been protected if more vaccine had been available.

To minimize the risk for getting or spreading the flu:

- Avoid contact with other people who have respiratory infections and colds.
- ☆ When you are ill, stay home from work and avoid contact with other people.
- ☆ Cover your coughs and sneezes with tissue, or cough into your shirtsleeve.
- ☆ Wash your hands frequently and after touching your nose and mouth.
- If you do develop an illness, contact your health care provider for advice about possible treatment or evaluation.

To protect the people at highest risk for severe influenza, we are relying on the public and health care providers to understand who is at highest risk for influenza complications and reserve our limited flu vaccine supplies for them.
