Emergency Preparedness for Child Care Providers: Excellence Award Series

This class is designed for both child care center providers and family child care home providers. The City of Bellevue Fire Department and Public Health – Seattle & King County have joined together to provide a series of 4 classes designed to help child care providers develop a comprehensive disaster plan. The series will teach child care providers how to plan for taking care of children and staff for an extended time due to severe weather or a disaster. Topics will include: writing the emergency plan, maximizing staff for effective emergency response, what and how much supplies you need, educating and recruiting parent volunteers, parent/child reunion, and effective drills. Participants will leave with sample forms and an organizational plan for response.

Participants completing the program and homework assignments will be eligible to apply for the "Excellence Award for Child Care Programs."

This is a four part series. The series of 4 classes is \$64 and offers 10 STARS credits. Please register for the entire series. If necessary, someone else from your program can substitute for one or more classes (a program must have at least 1 staff person at each class in order to be eligible for the Excellence Award).

We are offering a class on Food Safety in Child Care which includes the option to take the test to get your Food Handler Card.

Designed for people working in child care programs, this class will cover food safety concerns in a child care setting. The training will also include all the essential components required to take the Food Handler Card test. The Food Handler Card test is offered at the end of class.

We are offering 3 different options for this class (please make checks payable to SKCDPH):

Option 1 To receive 1.5 STARS Credits and a Food Handler Card:

Plan to stay until 8:30 pm and send us a registration payment of \$18.

Option 2 To receive a Food Handler Card only:

Plan to stay until 8:30 pm and send us a registration payment of \$10.

Option 3 To receive 1.5 STARS credits only:

Plan to stay until 8:00 (you will not have to take the food handler test) and send us a

registration payment of \$8.

WHEN FAMILIES WANT TO SEND FOOD (SNACKS) TO CHILD CARE

Your program may allow families to bring snacks to your child care center -

- To provide children with familiar foods including ethnic or cultural foods
 - To reduce costs
 - To educate families

As a child care provider if **YOU CHOOSE** to have families bring snacks *either daily for their own child or once or twice a month for the entire classroom or center* **YOU ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY:**

- 1. For the sanitation, safety, and quality of the foods served in your program and that the WAC regulations are met.
- 2. For assuring that the snacks provided are limited to those store-purchased, such as uncut, whole, fruits and vegetables or foods pre-packaged in the original manufacturer's container.
- 3. For planning the menu 1 week in advance.
- 4. For assuring that the snacks meet the WAC regulations for adequate nutrition:
 - Vitamin C source daily
 - Vitamin A source three times a week
 - Each snack must have 2 components from different food groups (e.g., orange wedge and raisin toast)
 - Each snack must include a beverage which can be water
- 5. For assuring foods are age-appropriate and are served in the proper amounts. Foods served and portion sizes for each age group must be written on the menu or otherwise documented. Examples of age appropriate foods are:
 - Applesauce or peeled apples for toddlers
 - Apple slices for pre-school
 - Whole apples for school-age (Families can bring apples or commercial applesauce.)
- 6. For keeping food on hand to meet the planned menu for those times a family forgets or brings the wrong foods. *If changes are made you must record the changes on the menu.*
- 7. For developing a policy for families about how often, what kind and how much food to bring and how food is to be handled.
- 8. For assuring that a child with special dietary needs is accommodated.



IF A FOODBORNE OUTBREAK HAPPENS IN YOUR CENTER YOU WILL BE HELD LEGALLY RESPONSIBLE, EVEN IF THE FOOD WAS PREPARED BY A PARENT.

REMEMBER: AS A LICENSED CHILD CARE FACILITY, YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE!

<u>PROTECT</u> your business and yourself! Have parents bring food in the original containers (as purchased in the store). If the planned snack was apples and cheese then the parent would bring in "X" pounds of apples and cheese (in the original container). You would then cut the apples and cheese into proper age-appropriate portions and sizes, and serve.

REMEMBER: You are responsible for making sure the children are fed safely.



A word about the few "special" days a year when parents bring food.



You should have a policy stating what foods you will accept. Suggestions for things you may want to include in your policy:

- You will only take baked goods from commercial sources and in their original packages. You cannot know the food safety skills of the parent who made the food. Most home baked cookies, cakes, etc. contain potentially hazardous foods like milk and/or eggs. Not everyone handles foods in a safe and sanitary manner. Can you afford the risk?
- A policy that parents bring in non-food items and you supply the snack served with 100% fruit juice or milk. (Serve low-fat milk to children 2 years of age and older.)
- Suggestions for parents about non-food items for birthdays and other special occasions, such as:

Colorful stickers
Streamers

Cultural materials

A game to play Special art projects

 An invitation to parents to visit and teach a special skill or bring something to observe and learn about. Celebrating the special day in a unique way is often a learning experience for both children and parents.
