Food for Special Occasions An alphabetical array of nutritious choices for birthdays and special occasions celebrated at child care

(Remember that food brought from home is limited to store purchased <u>uncut</u> fruit and vegetables or foods packaged in original manufacturer's containers. Parents can provide recipes and ask the child care cook if they are willing to prepare the special food.)

- **A** Apples—sliced, whole or in applesauce cups.
- **B** Berries (or bananas)—fresh or frozen. Have a smoothie party at school!
- *C* Cherries—a special treat when they are in season in June. Watch those pits!! Children under 3 can eat cantaloupe!
- **D** Dried fruit—Try dried mango. It is wonderful and so sweet!
- **E** Egg cream—Pour ¼ C. skim milk in a glass. Add 2 T. chocolate syrup and stir. Slowly pour in ¾ C. club soda and stir quickly. Makes a delicious and festive drink.
- **F** Fruit-filled muffin—Try pumpkin apple streusel muffins or lemon blueberry muffins.
- **G** Go-gurt—an easy and nutritious item. Can be served frozen too.
- H Hummous—a great Middle Eastern dip served with pita bread or raw vegetables.
- I lce cream sandwiches—Look for ones made with reduced fat ice cream.
- **J** Juice popsicles—100% juice popsicles are great on a hot day.
- **K** Kiwi fruit—slice in half and eat with a spoon.
- Low fat frozen yogurt—serve in cones for special occasions. Tastes like ice cream!
- Melon—try cantaloupe, honeydew or watermelon skewered on straws.
- **N** Nachos—have a south-of-the-border fiesta with tortilla chips and melted cheese. Serve with salsa and guacamole.
- **O** Orange smoothies—blend 2 ice cubes, ³/₄ C. orange juice, 1 C. flavored yogurt and ¹/₂ banana per child for a delicious smoothie.
- **P** Popcorn—a fun party item that is also a whole grain! Children under age 3 can eat soft pretzels.
- **Q** Quick cooking oats—make oatmeal cookies with raisins for added nutritional value.
- **R** Raisins---small boxes are fun to eat. Children under age 3 can eat raspberry yogurt.

s	Strawberries—sweet and juicy in season! Serve with a yogurt dip.
Т	Trail mix—combine Chex and Cheerio cereals, pretzels, raisins, dried fruit, seeds for a healthy snack.
υ	Unusual or exotic fruitstry longans, papaya or Asian pear apples.
V	Vegetable tray—try colorful items such as bell peppers, carrots, snap peas and jicama. Serve with a dip.
W	Waffles—serve with fruit toppings for a party or special event.
×	eXperiment with theme parties—for Memorial Day or the 4 th of July serve red (strawberries), white (peeled bananas) and blue fruits (blueberries) served in the shape of a flag.
У	Yogurt and fruit parfaits—layer vanilla yogurt and berries. Top with granola. Children often enjoy making their own fruit parfait.
Z	Zucchini bread—or other fruit breads such as banana or applesauce.

- Option 3 To receive 1.5 STARS credits <u>only</u>: Plan to stay until 8:00 (you will not have to take the food handler test) and send us a registration payment of \$8.
