New On-line Bloodborne Pathogens/HIV/AIDS Class

In partnership with Puget Sound Educational Service District, the Child Care Health Program will pilot a new on-line Bloodborne Pathogens/HIV/AIDS course beginning in September. The course will allow child care providers to complete their Bloodborne Pathogens/HIV/AIDS course requirement at home or work at their convenience. Access to the internet is required. The class is open to a pilot group of participants who will be expected to complete an evaluation as part of the pilot and contact us with any difficulties they encounter in taking the class. If you are interested in being a part of the pilot group of students, please contact us at (206) 296-2770. The cost of the pilot class is \$25.

Once we have successfully piloted the course, we will offer it on an on-going basis. Providers will be able to access the course through the Child Care Health website at www.metrokc.gov/health/childcare. Please watch for it later in the fall.

Children's Oral Health

Why is it Important?

Children's teeth are important for eating, speaking, socializing and general good health. Chronic dental disease can have a negative impact on a child's health and well-being.

What can childcare providers do to promote oral health?

Ask families about each child's oral health:

- Ask for the name, address and phone number of the child's dental provider for your records. This is important emergency information.
- What was the date of the child's last dental checkup? (Children should have their first dental exam around age 1.)

Consider beginning a toothbrushing program. For more information turn to the next page!

Children may be eligible for the ABCD (Access to Baby and Child Dentistry) Program which serves children 5 years old or younger who are enrolled in Medicaid or have medical coupons and live in Seattle or King County. ABCD focuses on preventive and restorative dental care for Medicaid-eligible children from birth through age five with an emphasis on the first dental visit by age one.

To link older children and those without Medicaid to a dentist call the phone numbers above.





TOOTHBRUSHING IN CHILD CARE PROGRAMS

Toothbrushing decreases the colonization of bacteria on teeth by disrupting the formation of plaque. The use of fluoridated toothpaste strengthens tooth enamel making the enamel more resistant to the acid produced by bacteria. Toothbrushing in the classroom improves the child's oral health, teaches basic hygiene and health promotion, and helps establish a lifelong prevention habit.

Fluoridated toothpaste is not recommended for children under 2 years old, or who are unable to spit out toothpaste after brushing.

Always supervise toothbrushing to insure:

- a routine which enhances learning
- proper toothpaste usage
- good toothbrushing technique
- toothbrushes are not shared and are handled properly
- children do not walk with toothbrushes in their mouths.

Teachers may want to brush their own teeth to model the desired behavior.

Toothbrushes

- Each child must have his/her own toothbrush with his/her name clearly marked on the handle with a marker. Children must not share or borrow toothbrushes.
- Use small toothbrushes with soft, rounded nylon bristles that are short and even.
- Replace toothbrushes every 3 months or sooner if the bristles become splayed or the toothbrush is contaminated.
- Do not disinfect toothbrushes or put in the dishwasher.
- Store toothbrushes so that they will not contaminate each other:
 - open to air with the bristles up
 - unable to drip on one another
 - not in contact with each other or any other thing.



Toothbrushing Procedure

Toothbrushing at a Table (Recommended)

- Teacher(s) assisting with toothbrushing wash hands.
- As children finish eating, they are given a small paper cup with a small amount of water in the bottom and their toothbrush.
- Teacher dispenses toothpaste in a manner that eliminates cross-contamination, e.g., via pea-sized dots of toothpaste around the rim of a paper plate or top of cup).
- Child begins brushing on the biting surface, and then moves from area to area (left-to-right and top-to-bottom) around the mouth.
- Brushing continues for at least one minute. (Exposure to fluoridated toothpaste is beneficial even with unsatisfactory brushing technique).
- Child takes small sip of water and then spits water and toothpaste residue back into paper cup.
- If desired, child may then be given a cleansing drink of water from another cup.
- Child holds the toothbrush over the designated rinse container and the teacher pours water from a clean water source over the toothbrush to rinse it.
- The child hands the toothbrush to the teacher, who replaces it in the drying rack.
- Child throws the paper cup away.
- Table is cleaned with the 3-step process (clean, rinse, sanitize).

Toothbrushing at a Classroom Sink

- Teacher(s) assisting with toothbrushing wash hands.
- Sink and faucet are cleaned, rinsed, and sanitized.
- Water from a clean water source is obtained.
- Teacher hands each child a small cup of water and his/her toothbrush.
- Teacher dispenses toothpaste in a manner which eliminates cross-contamination, e.g. via pea-sized dots of toothpaste around the rim of a paper plate or at top of cup.
- Child begins brushing on the biting surface, and then moves from area to area (left-to-right and top-to-bottom) around the mouth.
- Brushing continues for a least one minute. (Exposure to fluoridated toothpaste is beneficial even with unsatisfactory brushing technique.)
- When brushing is completed, child spits excess toothpaste into sink and rinses his/her mouth with a drink from the cup of water.
- Child holds the toothbrush over the sink and the teacher pours water from a clean water source over the toothbrush to rinse it.
- If desired, child may then use their paper cup and be given a cleansing drink of water from a clean water source.
- The child hands the toothbrush to the teacher, who replaces it in the drying rack.
- Child throws the paper cup away.
- Classroom handwashing sink is cleaned with 3-step process after all the children are finished.

IMPORTANT RECALL INFORMATION

There have been a large number of recalls these past two months that involve products relating to children. Many of these were for toys that were found to contain lead. The Child Care Health Program recommends that all child care providers visit the Consumer Product Safety Commission's (CPSC) website at www.cpsc.gov and click on "Recalls and Product Safety News" or call the CPSC hotline at 1-800-638-2772 for detailed information on recalls. Remember to check the website for recalls when you buy used furniture and toys.

Sign up to be notified about recalls

To sign up to receive e-mails from the CPSC when children's products are recalled go to www.cpsc.gov and click on "Recalls and Product Safety News." Scroll down and click on "Join our recall notification list" (on lower left hand side of screen). Check the "Infant/Child" product box when you sign up and you will receive e-mails when children's products are recalled.

Recent Crib Recalls

Simplicity Cribs made in China and sold in department stores, children's stores and mass merchandisers nationwide from January 1998 through May 2007 for between \$100 and \$300. The recalled Simplicity crib models include: Aspen 3 in 1, Aspen 4 in 1, Nursery-in-a-Box, Crib N Changer Combo, Chelsea and Pooh 4 in 1. The recall also involves the following Simplicity cribs that used the Graco logo: Aspen 3 in 1, Ultra 3 in 1, Ultra 4 in 1, Ultra 5 in 1, Whitney and the Trio.

The recalled cribs have one of the following model numbers, which can be found on the envelope attached to the mattress support and on the label attached to the headboard: 4600, 4605, 4705, 5000, 8000, 8740, 8910, 8994, 8050, 8750, 8760, and 8996.

"Moderne" and "Loft" Cribs made in Poland for NettoCollection LLC and sold in Juvenile furniture stores nationwide from October 2003 through June 2005 for about \$1,350.
