Emergency Preparedness for Child Care Providers: Excellence Award Series

This class is designed for both child care center providers and family child care home providers. The City of Bellevue Fire Department and Public Health – Seattle & King County have joined together to provide a series of 4 classes designed to help child care providers develop a comprehensive disaster plan. The series will teach child care providers how to plan for taking care of children and staff for an extended time due to severe weather or a disaster. Topics will include: writing the emergency plan, maximizing staff for effective emergency response, what and how much supplies you need, educating and recruiting parent volunteers, parent/child reunion, and effective drills. Participants will leave with sample forms and an organizational plan for response.

Participants completing the program and homework assignments will be eligible to apply for the "Excellence Award for Child Care Programs."

Each class is \$16 and earns 2.5 STARS credits. The series of 4 classes is \$64 and offers 10 STARS credits. It is recommended that you attend all of the classes (a program must have at least 1 staff person at each class in order to be eligible for the Excellence Award).

Head Lice

> What are head lice?

Lice are tiny insects that live on and crawl through the hair. They are gray, brown, or black and can be difficult to see. Lice need human blood to survive and will die within 24 hours if they cannot find a "meal." They lay eggs (nits) on hair close to the scalp. It takes about 6 days for the nits to hatch. Head lice are not a health hazard or a sign of uncleanliness, and do not cause the spread of any disease. The scalp may itch, and scratching can cause skin sores and skin infections.

> How are they spread from one person to another?

Most often head lice are spread by head-to-head contact with another person who has lice. Lice can be spread by wearing another person's hat or clothing, by using another person's comb, brush, or bedding, or by placing clothing worn by someone who has lice in a shared clothing storage compartment, locker, or a cloak room. Pets do not carry human lice.

> How can head lice outbreaks be prevented?

Do not share combs, brushes, towels, bedding, hats or clothing. Provide separate storage areas for each person's clothing and other personal articles. Put personal articles in individual bins or sacks. Assign sleeping mats and bedding to only one person and store these separately. Ask parents to check children's hair regularly for lice and nits. Children with lice or nits are required by WAC to be excluded from child care.

> What should I do if a child in my care has lice?

Lice and nits are most effectively removed by using a combination of combing and chemical-free treatments. The most important step in successfully treating lice is thorough, careful combing of the hair for lice and nits at least daily for 21 days. Detailed instructions for families to follow are available at (EPA school parent packet). It is important that families complete all of the steps recommended for treating head lice. Otherwise, the lice will reappear. Families may need your support in completing this process. Your Public Health Nurse is also available for assistance.
