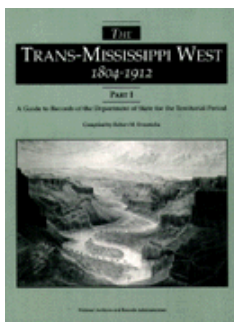

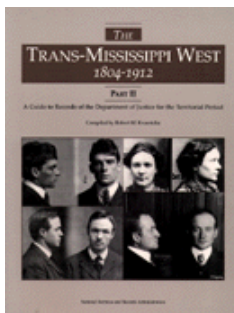
Black History: A Guide to Civilian Records in the National Archives \$25.00

This award-winning research guide provides accurate, concise information about civilian records held by the National Archives textual, photographic, and audiovisual that can be used to study the history of African Americans.



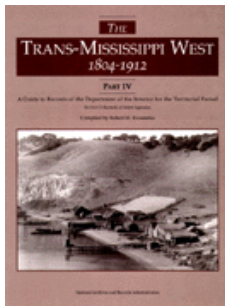
Part I: A Guide to Records of the Department of State for the Territorial Period \$25.00

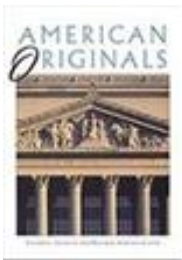
The Trans-Mississippi West, 1804 - 1912 **Part IV: Section 1 \$25.00**

This multi-volume guide identifies and describes records in the National Archives that are associated with the American West. These guides alert readers to the research potential of these records and assist in their location.



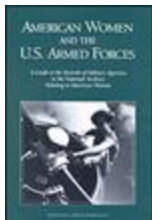
A TVA Album: The Early Years, 1933-46 \$10.00

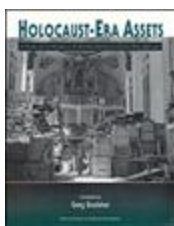
American Originals \$17.95

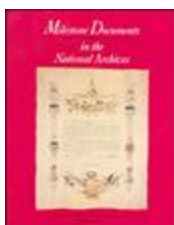

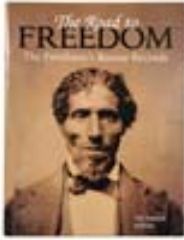
Holocaust Era Assets \$39.95

The Road to Freedom: The Freedmen's Bureau Records

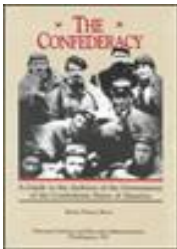

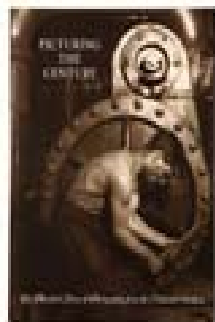
The Confederacy: A Guide to the Archives of the Government of the Confederate States of America **\$25.00**
