[Proposed class or classes of copyrighted work(s) to be exempted] = Compact Discs created so that they cannot be copied on to the computer hard drive \*of the person who bought the CD legally\* and, subsequently, an MP3 player \*of the person who bought the CD legally.\*

[Brief summary of the argument(s) in support of the exemption proposed above] = 1) People want to be able to listen to CDs that they buy on more compact media players than CD players.

- 2) Many people prefer smaller media players to CD players not only for convenience, but because auto CD players make cars more susceptible to theft.
- 3) Just because someone rips a CD to their computer, it doesn't mean they are distibuting the file.
- 4) The music industry should spend money developing technology for files that aren't distributable over the internet rather than creating CDs that can't rip onto harddrives.
- 5) Making CDs unrippable will lead many people just to download the album instead so they can listen to it on their digital media players.
