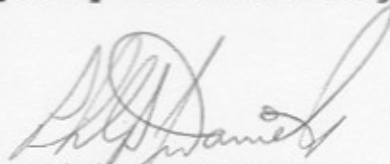

Subject: Employee Entitlement to Insurance Proceeds Provided  
in Connection With Official Travel

Attached is a copy of a Department of Labor, Office of Workers' Compensation Programs letter which clarifies an employee's entitlement to insurance coverage provided by certain Government sponsored travel programs.

Insurance proceeds from the coverage obtained as a result of purchasing common carrier transportation services through a Travel Management Center (TMC), contract travel agency or SATO, or charging the service on a contractor issued charge card [including a Government Travel System Account (GIS)] are not subject to offset against Federal Employees' Compensation Act benefits. A TMC is not required to provide insurance coverage for employees traveling on official business; therefore, insurance coverage may or may not be provided by the servicing TMC. If the TMC provides insurance coverage, this coverage is in addition to the coverage required by the General Services Administration contract for charge cards and GIS accounts.

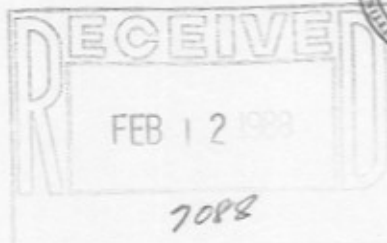

Dear Mr. Kendig

We have reviewed your January 13, 1988, letter seeking a determination on the effect on entitlement to benefits under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act (FECA, 5 U.S.C. 8101, et seq.) of certain insurance proceeds. Just as with other insurance proceeds, payments under policies provided by the Government Travel Service (GTS) program would not affect payment of benefits under the FECA.

As you noted, proceeds from insurance policies provided by Diners Club charge cards have no effect on eligibility for benefits under the FECA. Similarly, proceeds from insurance policies provided under the GTS program or by travel agencies when tickets are purchased through them, would not be covered by the limitations on the right to receive compensation found at section 8116 of the FECA.

You also asked what effect insurance proceeds may have on any settlement an employee's estate might be awarded through a damage suit against the government. This issue is not within the purview of this office. As you may be aware, section 8116(c) limits the liability of the United States with respect to an injury or death of an employee to the benefits enumerated in the FECA. Since the Justice Department handles suits under the Federal Tort Claims Act, they would be the proper agency to address the questions of whether an estate could sue the government at all, and if so what effect insurance proceeds would have on a recovery.

I hope this information meets your needs, and appreciate your consideration in consulting us on this matter.
