Project Goals	<p>To develop a coordinated Injury Prevention program that tracks unintentional injuries that occur on the Pueblo of San Felipe and utilize data to develop evidence based interventions to prevent injuries among San Felipe Pueblo Residents in culturally appropriate manner under the guidance of the Tribal Administration and Tribal Council.
