#### **Property Transformations**

#### March 2006

This property, located at 506 Tucker Street, is another example of citizens working with the Neighborhood Services Department by bringing their property into compliance with the City Code.

In March 2005, a Neighborhood Services Codes Enforcement Inspector originally inspected this property and determined the collapsing accessory structure (see before picture, immediately to the left) to be unfit for human habitation, in an emergency condition, and a danger to nearby inhabitants in accordance to Section 21-19 of the Municipal Codes.

The property owner swiftly complied with the Municipal Code by demolishing the accessory structure and rehabilitating the housing structure adjacent to the accessory structure.

In instances where a property is



in violation of the City Code, the City allows the property owner 30 days to bring the property into compliance. Property owners not complying within the 30 day window are cited to City Court, where a judge may levy fines and court costs on the property owner.


