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HIGHLIGHTS & SUMMARY

Highlights

- Preliminary estimates of 2007 Nevada labor market and economic activity are in, and, taken as a whole, they point to an economy that continues to grow, but at a pace much slower than in previous years.
- On a positive note, there is reason for optimism. An unfolding megaresort boom will result in approximately 40,000 new hotel rooms coming on-line in the next half-decade. That, coupled with a likely rebound in the housing sector within the next two years, is expected to add about 145,000 jobs in the Nevada economy through 2010.
- After topping out in early-2002, Nevada's unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted¹) trended down until the beginning of 2006, and it has been on the upswing, albeit unevenly, since. For all of 2007, preliminary estimates suggest that the jobless rate averaged 4.8%. That does not compare well with the 4.2% unemployment rate in 2006. The jobless rate

¹ The seasonal adjustment process removes the month-to-month seasonal effects from a data series. Over the course of a year, the levels of employment and unemployment undergo sharp fluctuations due to such seasonal developments as changes in weather, the planting and harvesting of crops, major holidays, and the opening and closing of schools. Since these seasonal events follow a more or less regular pattern each year, their influence on statistical trends

can be eliminated by adjusting the statistics from month to month.

- rose over the course of the year, rising from 4.5% in January to 5.8% in December.
- For the year, Nevada's jobless rate came in higher than the national average (4.6%), according to early estimates. This is the first time this has happened since 2001. For December, only seven states, including California, had a higher unemployment rate than Nevada's monthly tally.
- Clark County's unemployment rate in 2007 was identical to the State's. In Washoe County, preliminary estimates show a 4.6% reading.
 Throughout the balance of the State, the joblessness averaged 5.3%. Unemployment rates in the State's rural counties varied considerably, from 3.7% in Elko and Esmeralda to 7.7% in Mineral County.
- Nevada's economy generated nearly 25,000 jobs in 2007, based upon preliminary estimates. This comes on the heels of gains in the 60,000-70,000 range in each of the previous three years. Job growth continues to ease, and remains the lowest it has been since mid-2002. All told, Nevada's employment increase in 2007 totaled 1.9%. This compares favorably with the 1.3% estimate for the U.S. as a whole. Again, however, evidence of a slowdown is evident. During the previous three years, job gains in

- Nevada averaged 5.6% per year. That was nearly four times the average rate of growth in the U.S.
- We expect the final figures, when released this spring, to show that total job levels had actually slipped below year-ago readings in the final months of 2007.
- The weakness in the housing segment continues to impact the State's labor markets. Preliminary estimates of construction jobs in 2007, at 139,700, are off by 4,000 from a year ago. Construction job readings deteriorated as the year wore on. During the first three months of 2007, they were off by just 900 from a year ago, based upon preliminary estimates. During the final quarter of the year, they fell 7,000 below year-ago tallies.
- Other signs of the economic slowdown, especially on the consumer spending front, are evident in holiday hiring patterns. In 2007, Nevada retail employment grew 3.8% between October and December. During the previous ten years, job gains during the same two-month period averaged 4.9%.
- On a more positive note, an employment upturn in the leisure and hospitality sector at the end of the year probably reflects the impacts of the then-pending opening of the Palazzo. Over the May-October period in 2007, leisure and hospitality employment grew by less than 1% every month, according to preliminary estimates. In November and December, job growth

- ticked up to 1.4%. December job readings totaled 344,000 in this all-important industry.
- Las Vegas metropolitan statistical area (MSA) job growth averaged 2.1% over the course of 2007, slightly higher than Reno-Sparks' 1.7% gain. Jobs in the Carson City MSA actually declined slightly.
- Nevada average weekly wages came in at \$789 in the first half of 2007. This is up 4.3% from a year ago, and compares favorably to the 3.4% advance for all of 2006. However, growth eased in the second quarter of the year, to 3.7%, from 4.9% in the first quarter.
- Initial claims for unemployment insurance in Nevada grew at a double-digit rate in 11 of 12 months during 2007. For the entire year, claims averaged 13,700 per month, an increase of 20.6% over a year ago.
- Continued unemployment insurance claims remained well above year-ago readings. For the year, they were up approximately one-third. The average duration of UI claims continued to creep up, albeit unevenly. By year-end, it stood at 13.48 weeks, the highest reading since mid-2005. The number of individuals exhausting their unemployment insurance benefits also trended up, a pattern consistent with the moderating pace of economic growth. For the year, the number of recipients receiving final benefit payments averaged 2,200 per month, up nearly 40% from 2006.

- Through the first three quarters of 2007, there were 59,100 Nevada employers This translates into a gain of 4.9% from the same nine-month period a year ago. In recent years, the growth in the number of Nevada employers peaked in 2005, at more than 6%. It has eased in both 2006 and so far in 2007.
- Nevada's taxable sales, which comprise the tax base for the State's largest General Fund revenue source (the sales tax), have declined in seven of the past eight months, through November 2007. Sales through the first 11 months of the year totaled \$44.3 billion, a 0.3% decline from the same period in 2006. Over the course of the past ten years, the slowest growth in taxable sales, 2.7%, occurred in 2002. Hence, when final 2007 tallies are in, taxable sales will turn in their weakest showing in more than a decade.
- There were 36.12 million Las Vegas visitors through the first 11 months of 2007, up 0.7% from a year ago.
- Over the same period, gaming win is up just 1.7%.
 Win is very volatile, and can differ considerably from
 month-to-month. For instance, during the first 11
 months of 2007, growth ranged from a negative 14%
 in November to a positive10.3% in July. Gaming win
 has significant impacts on gaming tax collections, the
 second-largest General Fund revenue source.

- For all of 2006, Nevada personal income grew at a 7.9% pace. Income gains were the lowest since 2003. Still, Nevada continued to outpace the nation, where personal income grew just 6.6% in 2006. Through the first three quarters of 2007, income was up 7% in the State. Although growth continued to ease, trends in Nevada remain impressive relative to the nation's 6.3% advance.
- Activity on the residential real estate and construction front remains very worrisome. Statewide housing permit activity in 2007, at 27,200 permits, was down by one-third from a year ago.
- In southern Nevada, new home closings were down by 45% in 2007. Median prices for new homes fell from year-ago readings by nearly 20% in both November and December. During the final month of the year, the median price was \$280,100. Recorded resales were down 40% in 2007.

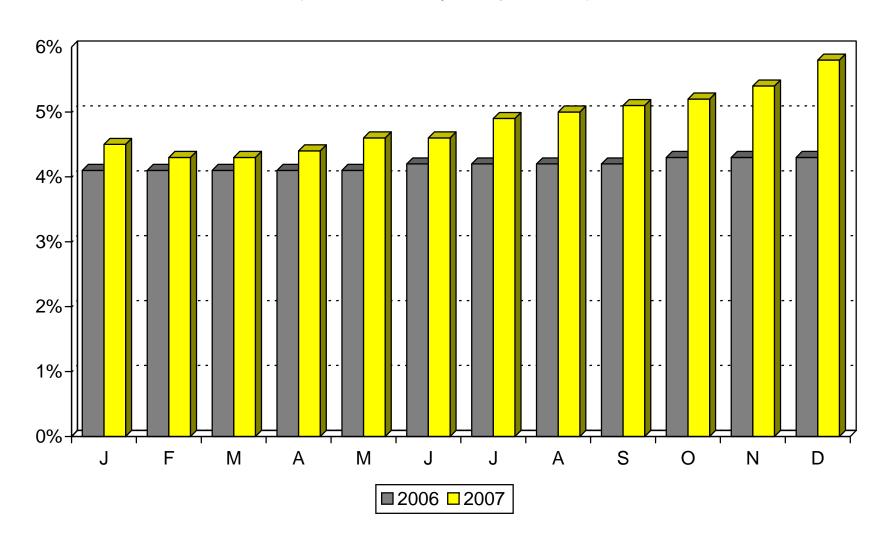

The federal/state cooperative program under which employment and unemployment estimates for states and local areas are developed is the Local Area Unemployment Statistics Program (LAUS). These estimates are prepared by state employment security agencies in accordance with Bureau of Labor Statistics definitions and procedures. They are used for planning and budgetary purposes, as an indication of need for employment and training programs, and to allocate federal funds under the Workforce Investment Act (WIA), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), etc.

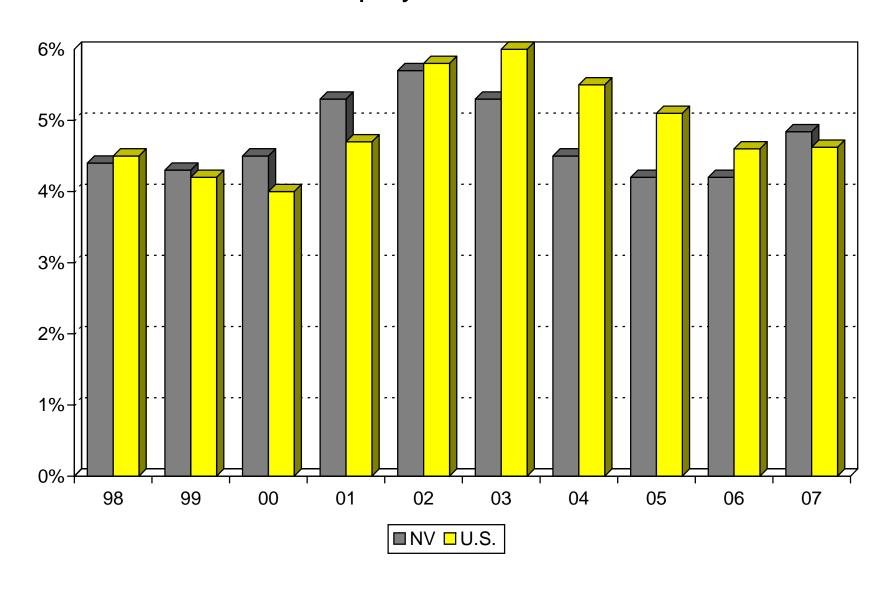
Nevada Unemployment Rate (seasonally adjusted)



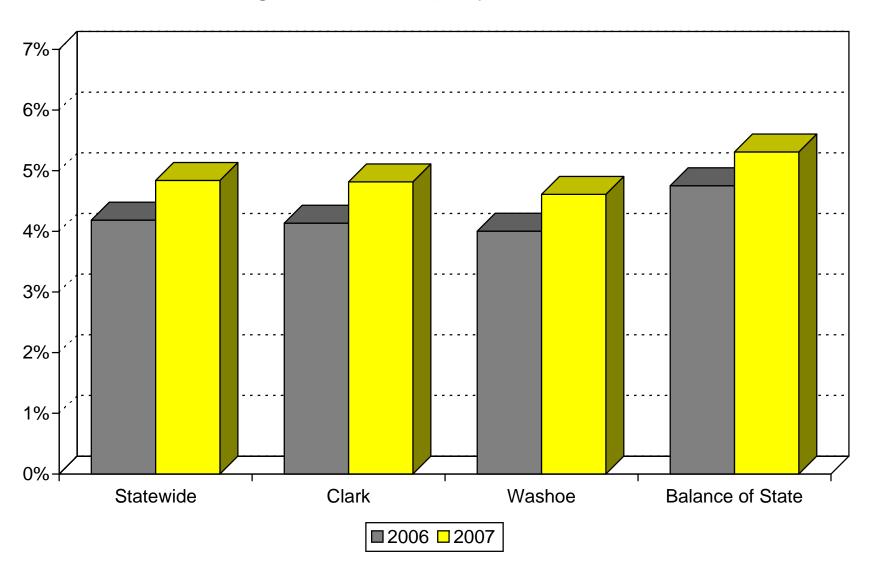
Nevada Unemployment Rate: 2007 vs. 2006 (seasonally adjusted)

Regional Unemployment Rates



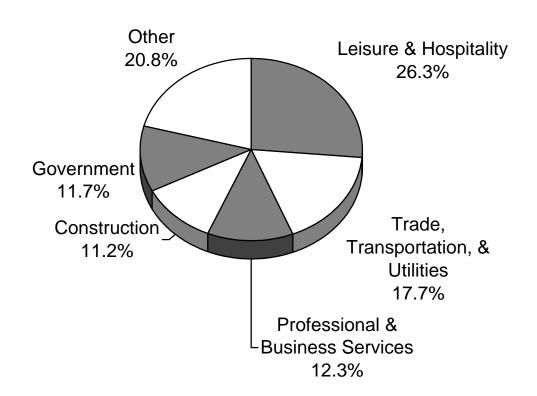

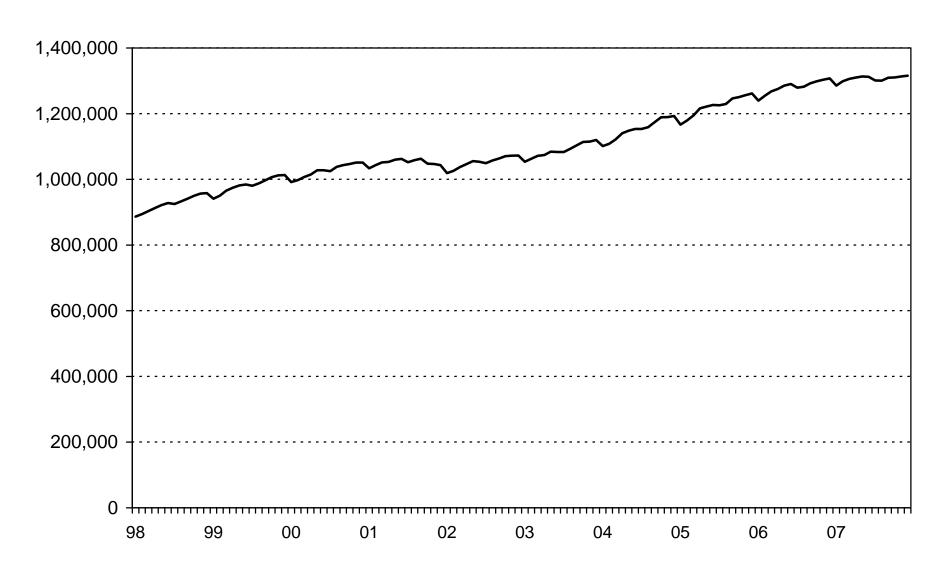

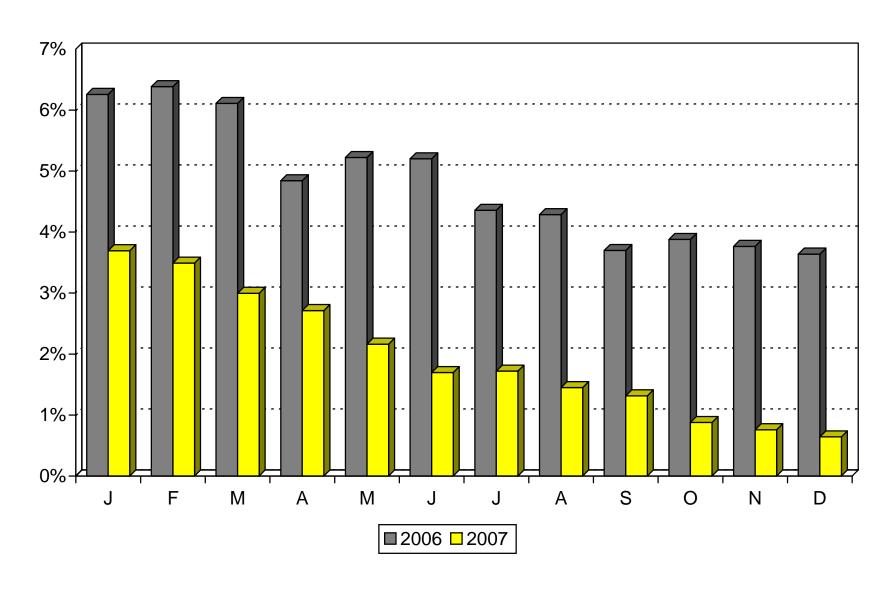
Nevada Jobs by Industry: 2006



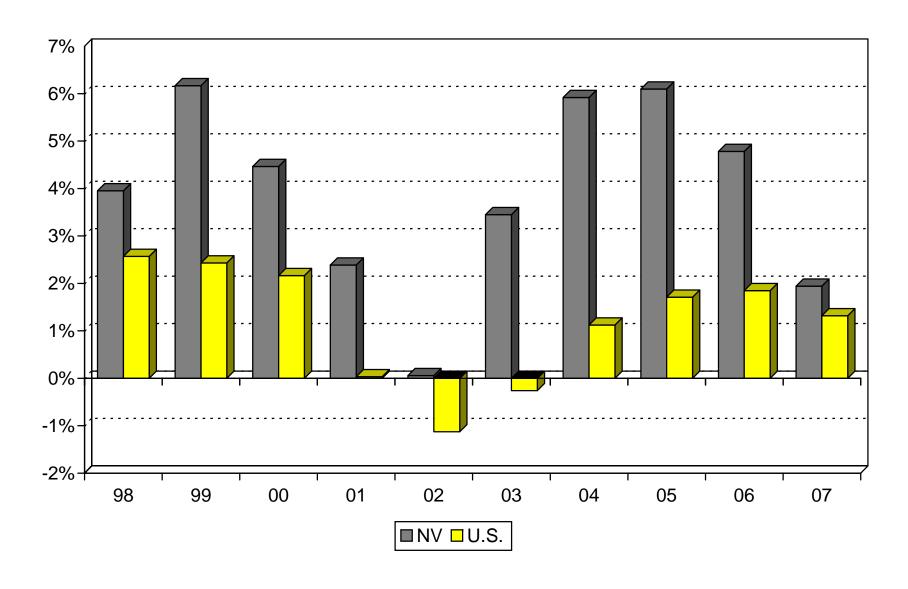
Nevada Jobs



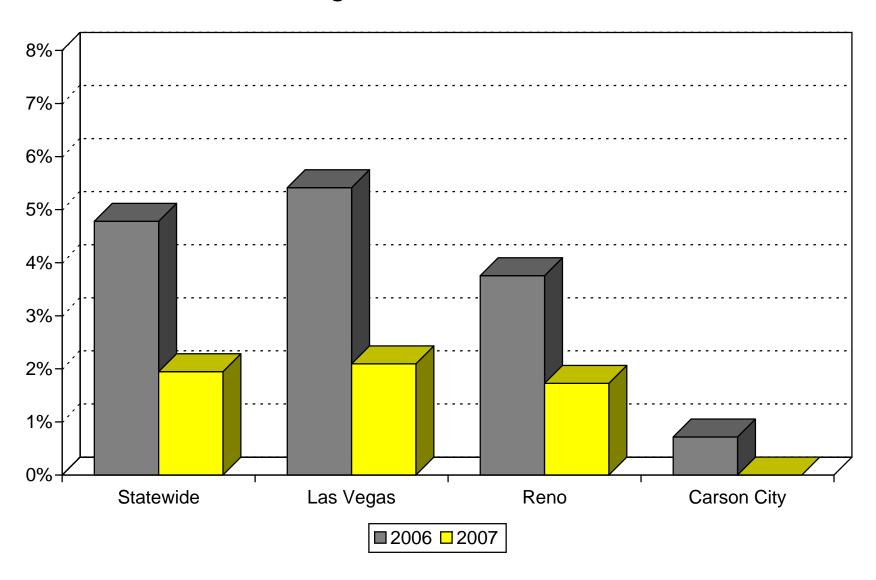
Nevada Job Growth: 2007 vs. 2006

Regional Job Growth



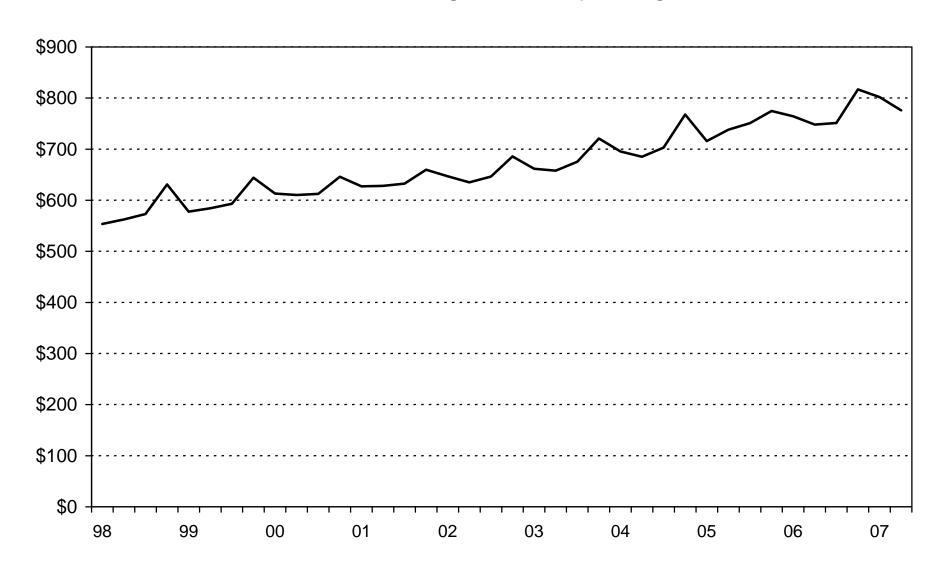

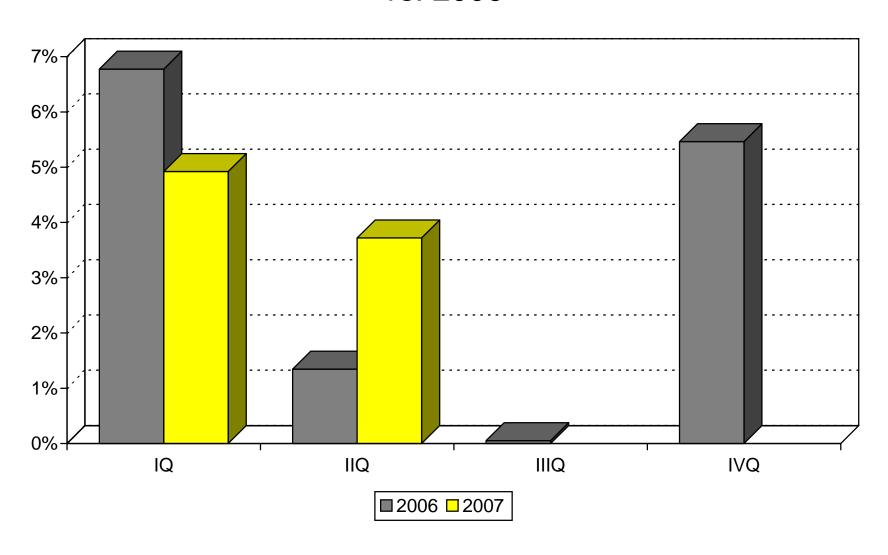

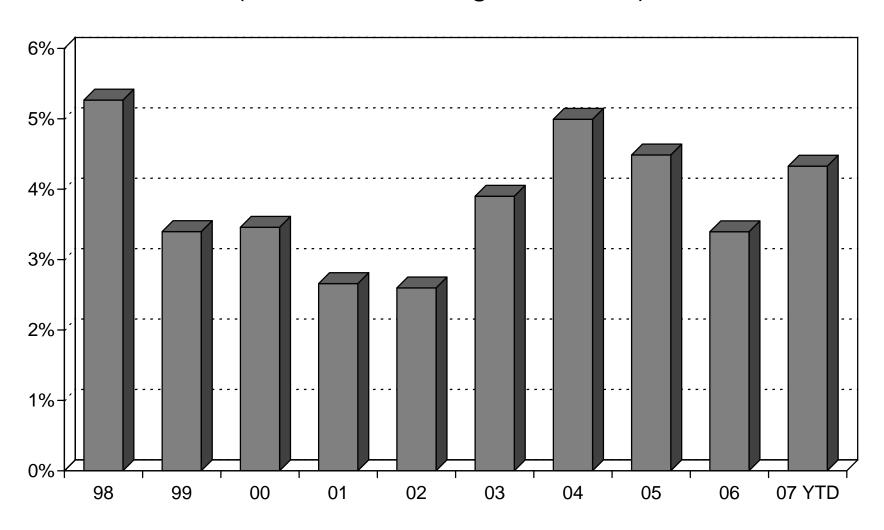
Nevada Average Weekly Wages

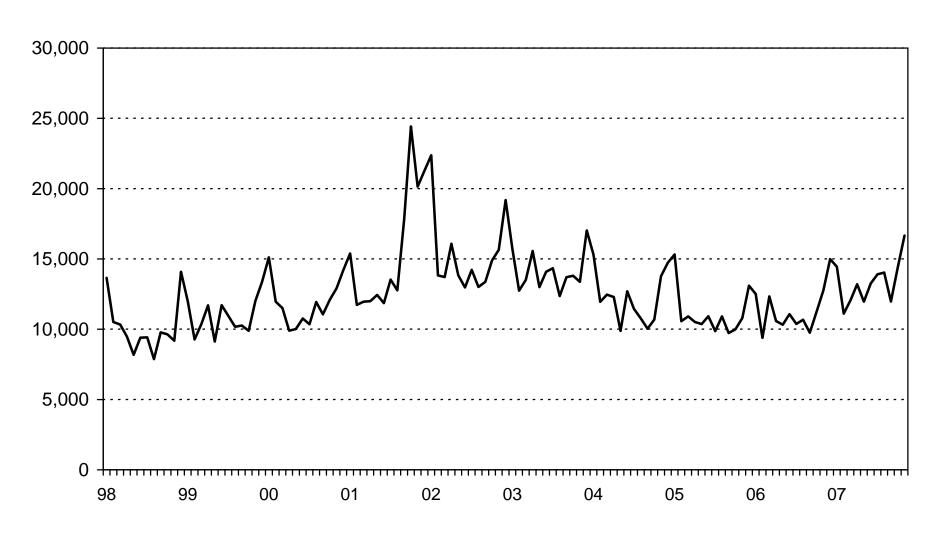

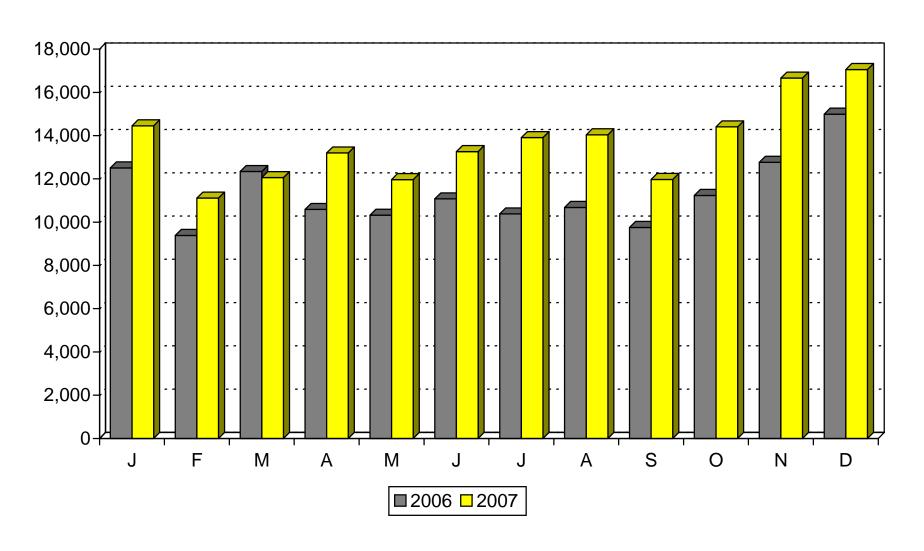

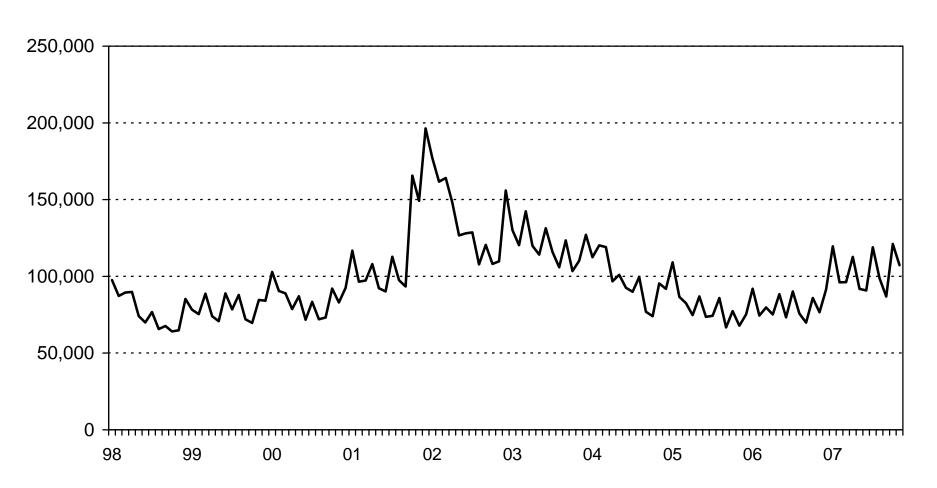
Nevada Initial Claims for Unemployment Insurance



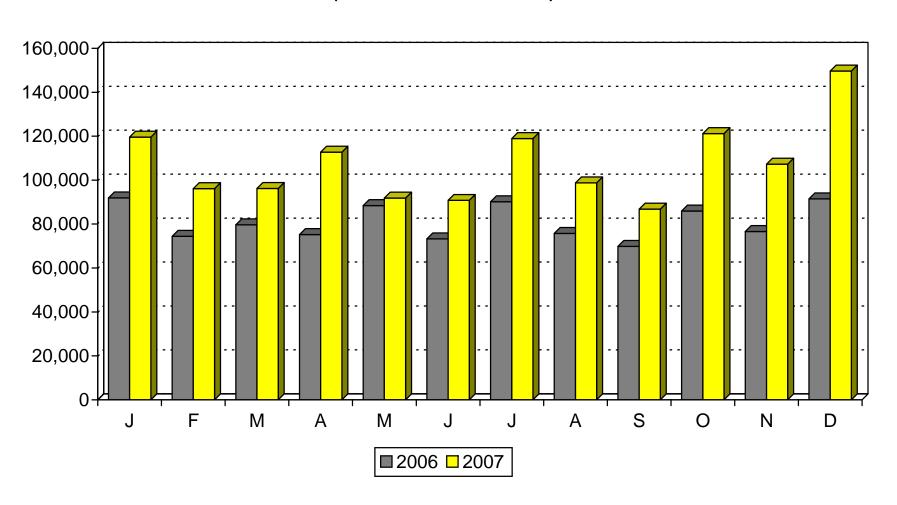
Nevada Initial Claims for Unemployment Insurance: 2007 vs. 2006



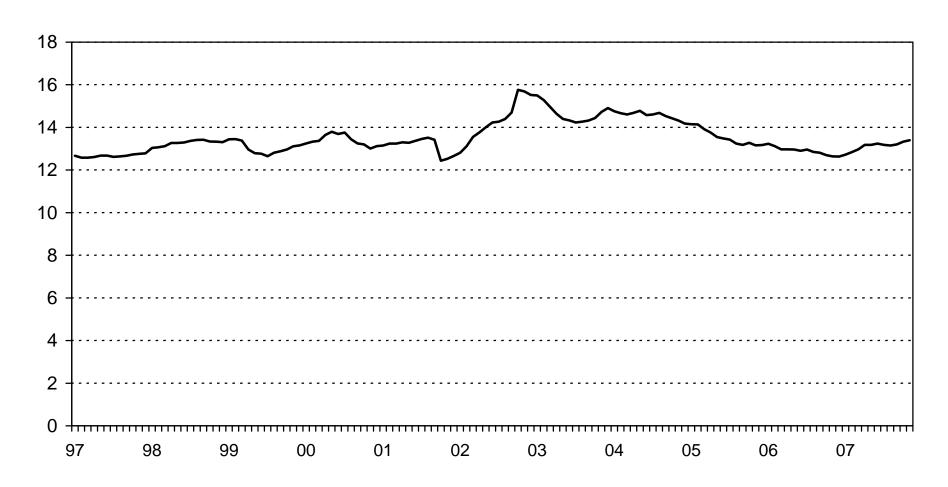
Nevada Continued Claims for Unemployment Insurance (weeks claimed)



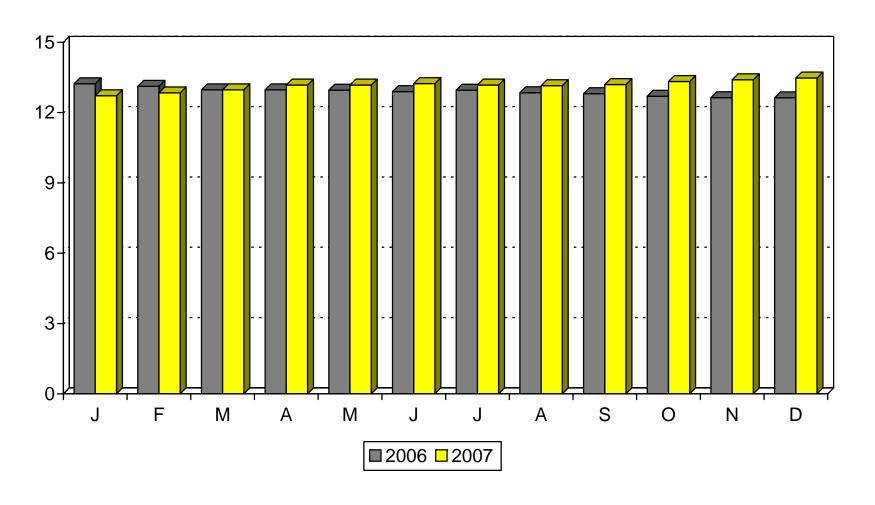
Nevada Continued Claims for Unemployment Insurance: 2007 vs. 2006 (weeks claimed)



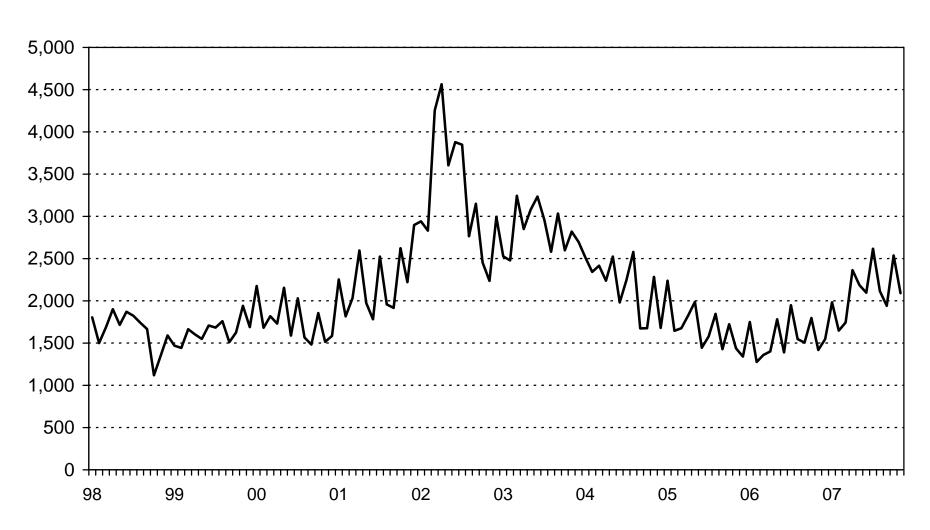
Average Duration of Nevada Unemployment Insurance Claims (weeks; 12-month moving average)



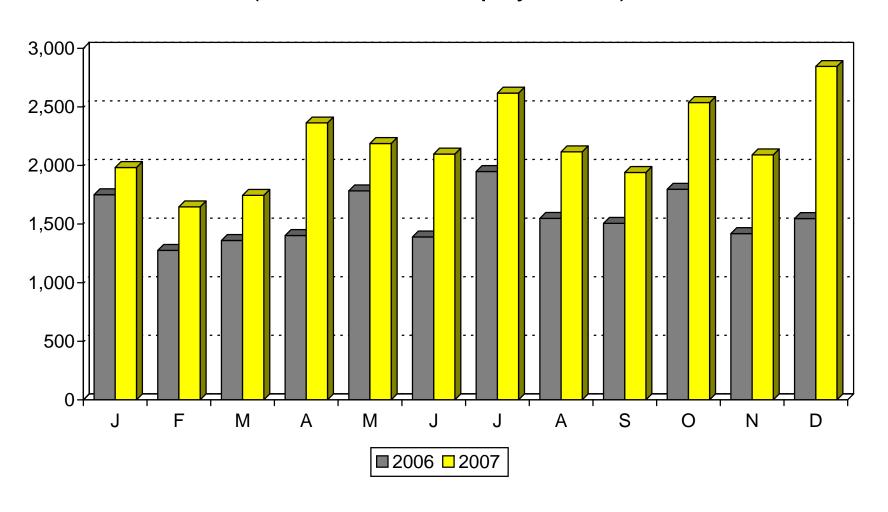
Average Duration of Nevada Unemployment Insurance Claims: 2007 vs. 2006 (weeks; 12-month moving average)

Nevada Unemployment Insurance Exhaustions: 2007 vs. 2006 (number of final payments)



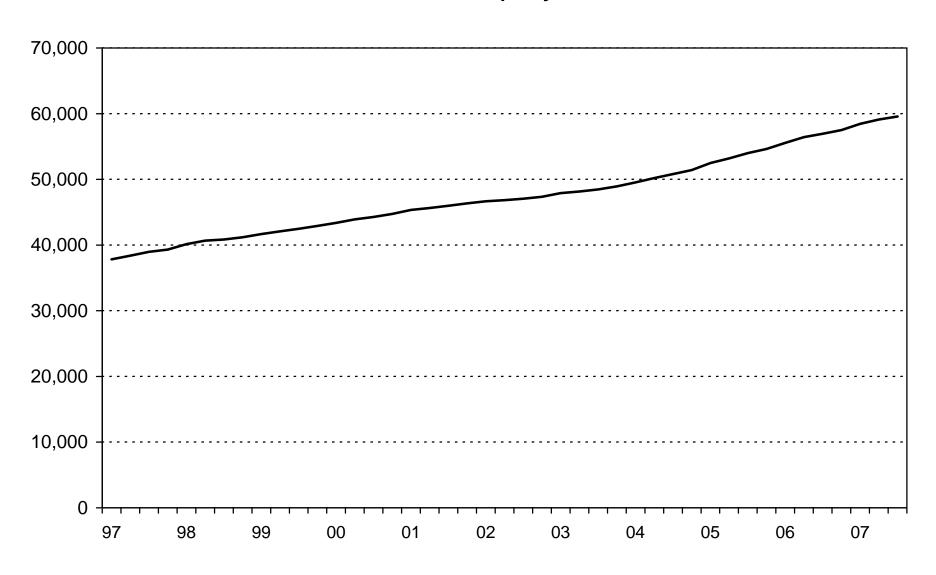

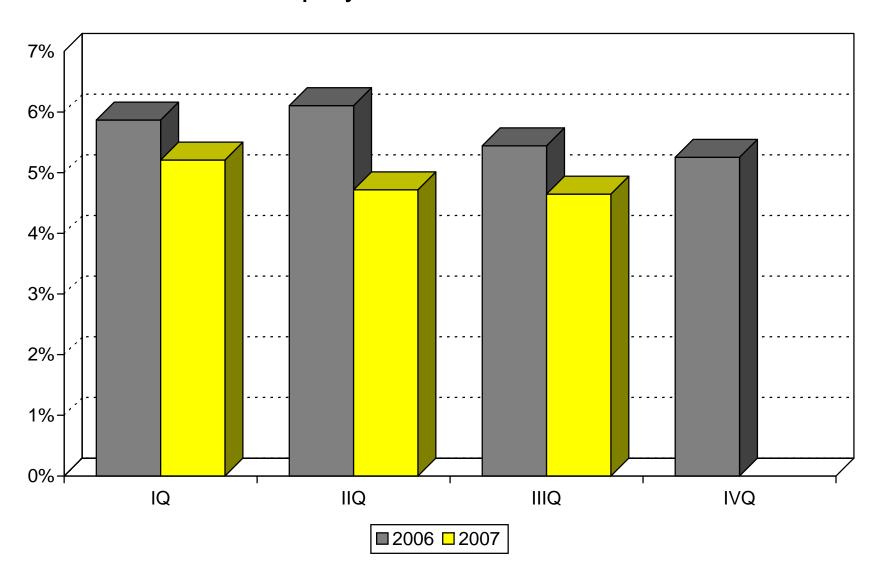

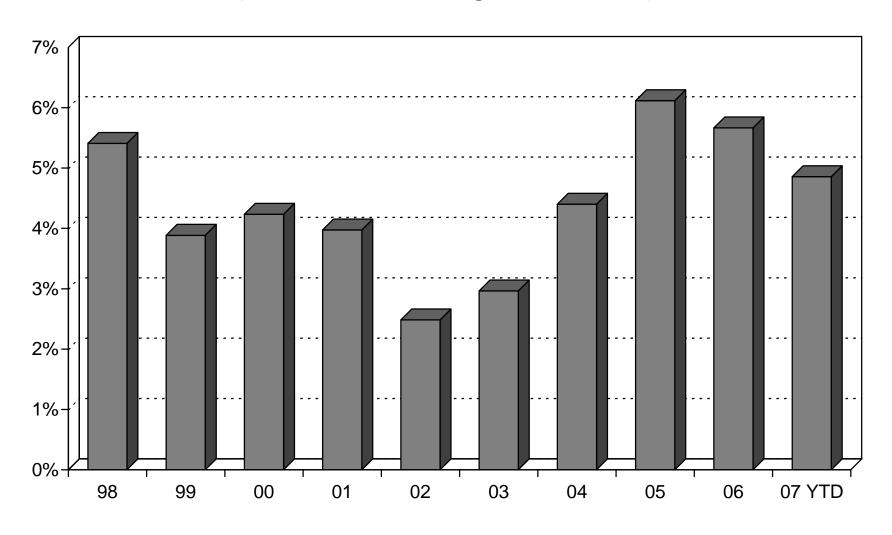

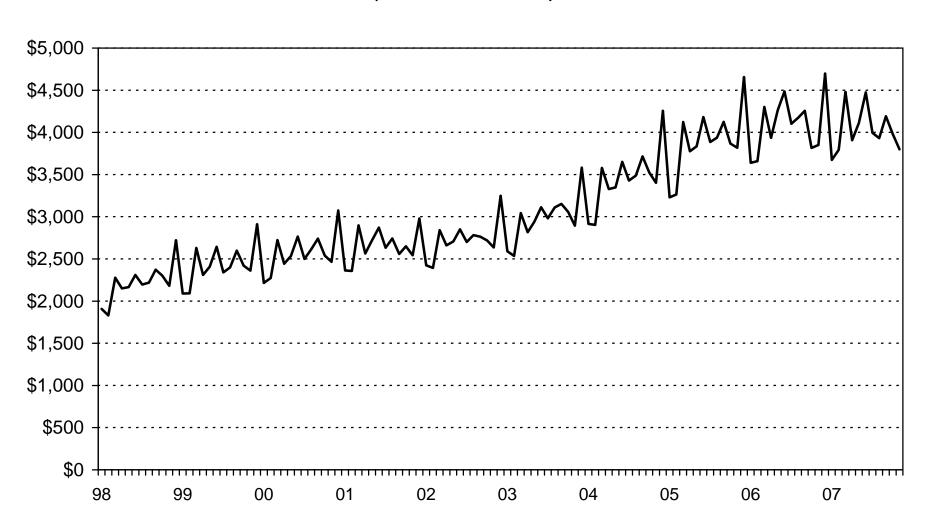

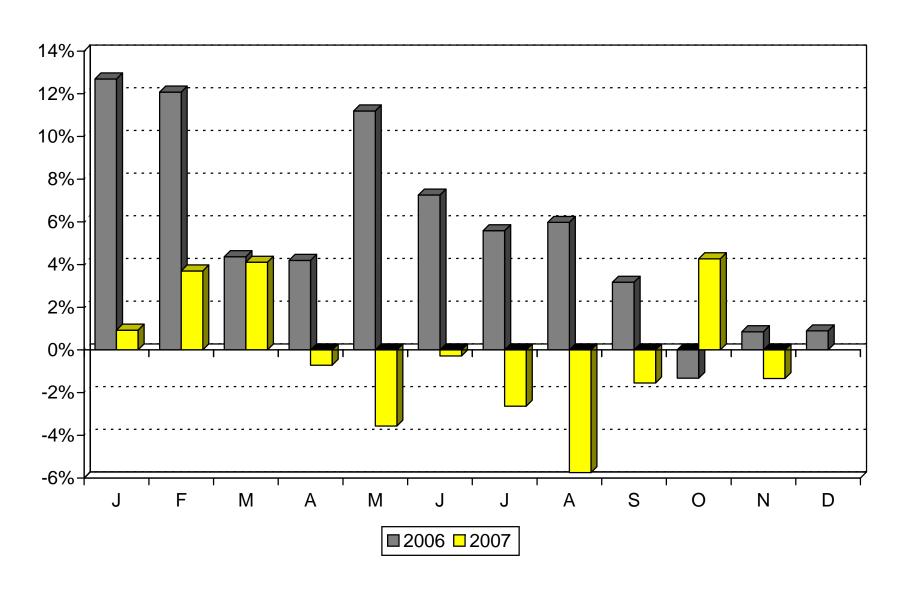

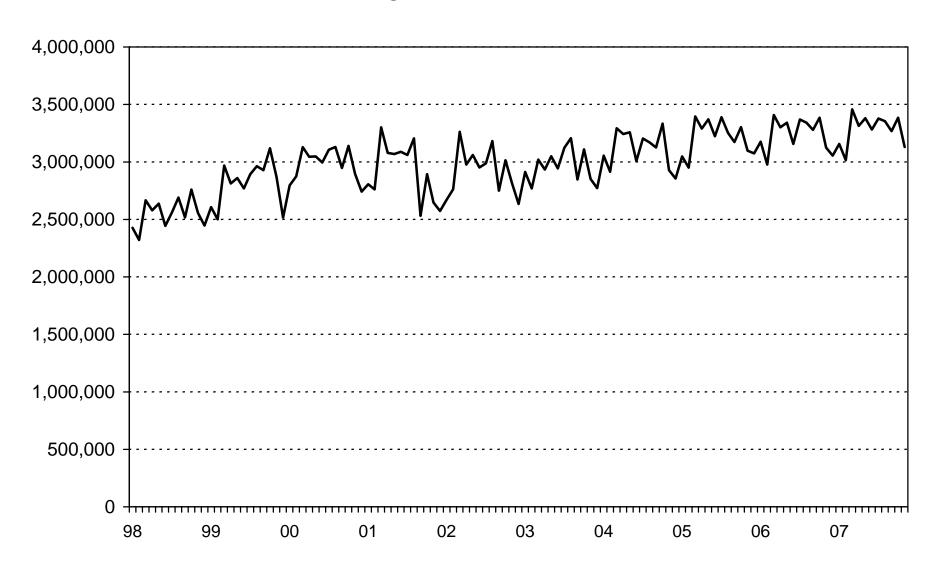
Nevada Taxable Sales (millions of \$)



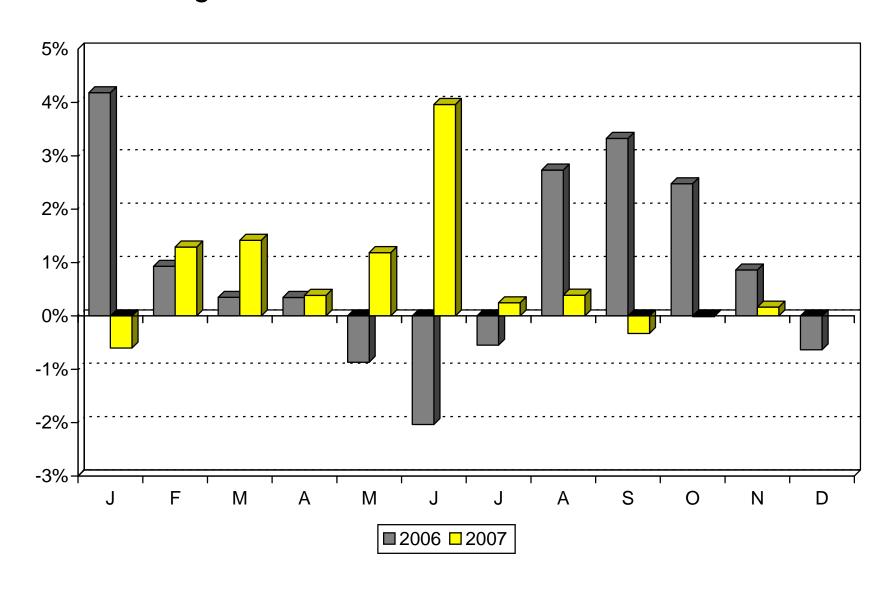
Nevada Taxable Sales Growth: 2007 vs. 2006



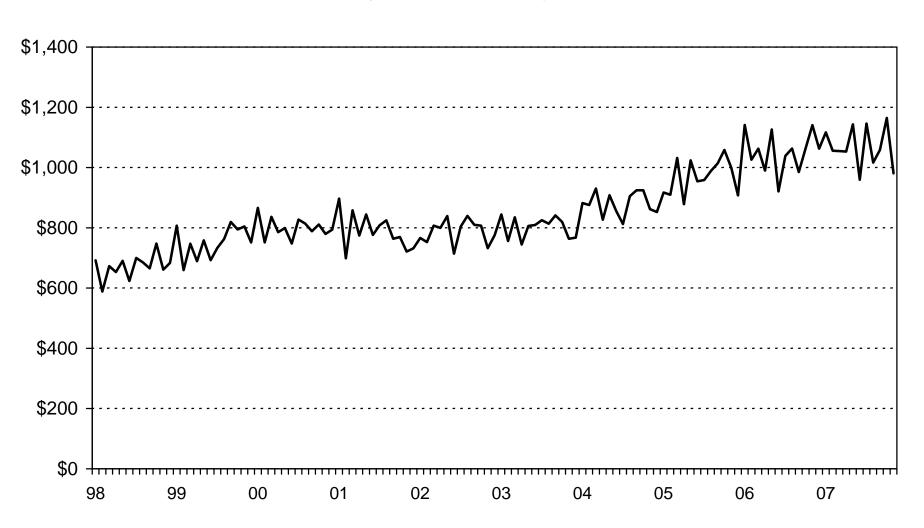
Las Vegas Visitor Volume



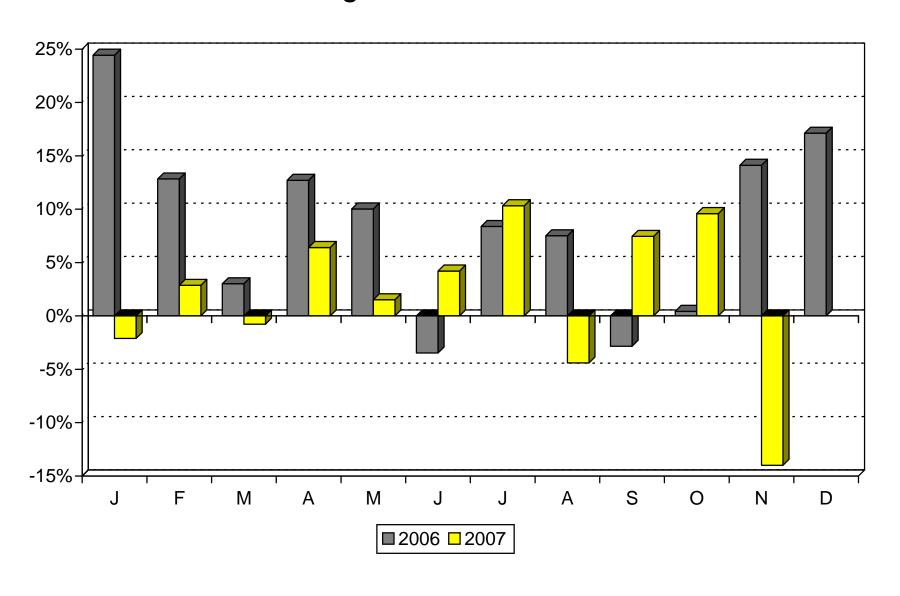
Las Vegas Visitor Volume Growth: 2007 vs. 2006

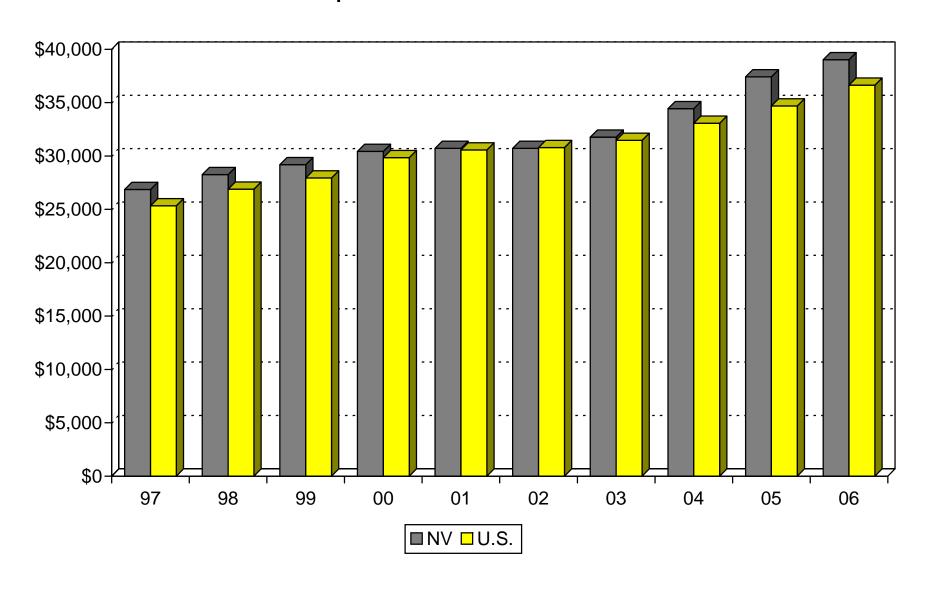

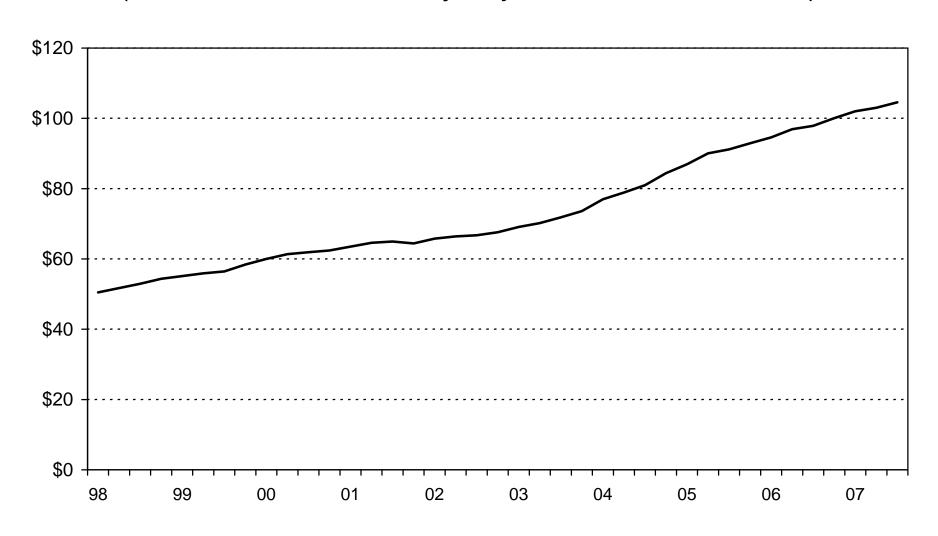

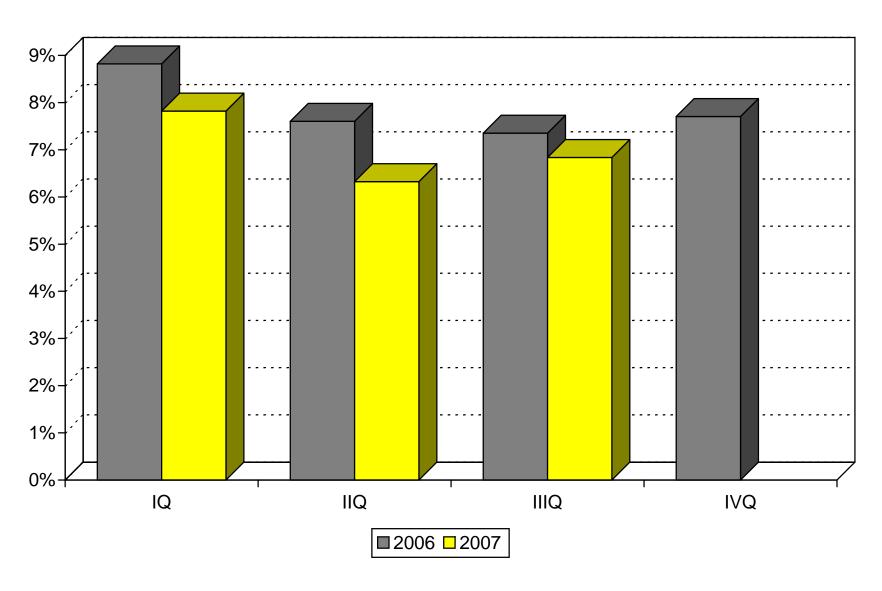
Nevada Per Capita Personal Income vs. the U.S.



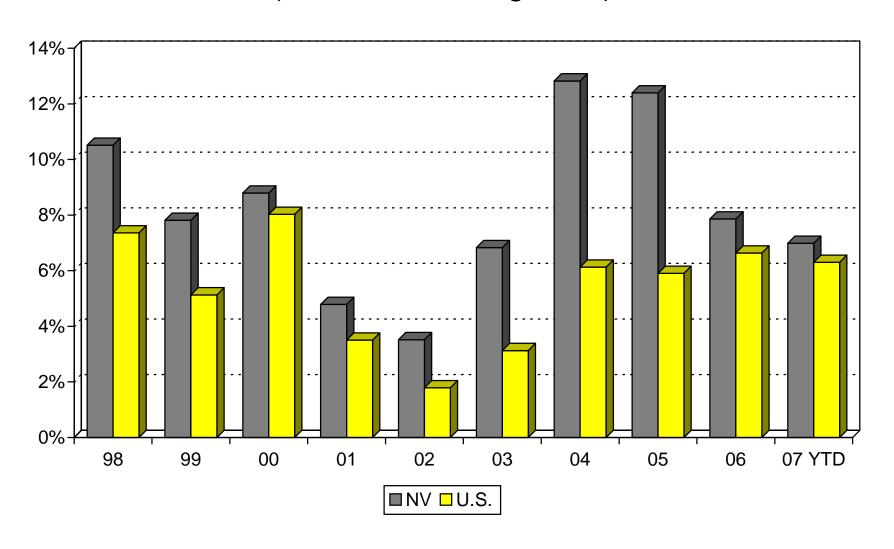
Nevada Personal Income (billions of \$; seasonally adjusted at annual rates)

Nevada Personal Income Growth vs. the U.S. (2007 YTD through IIIQ)



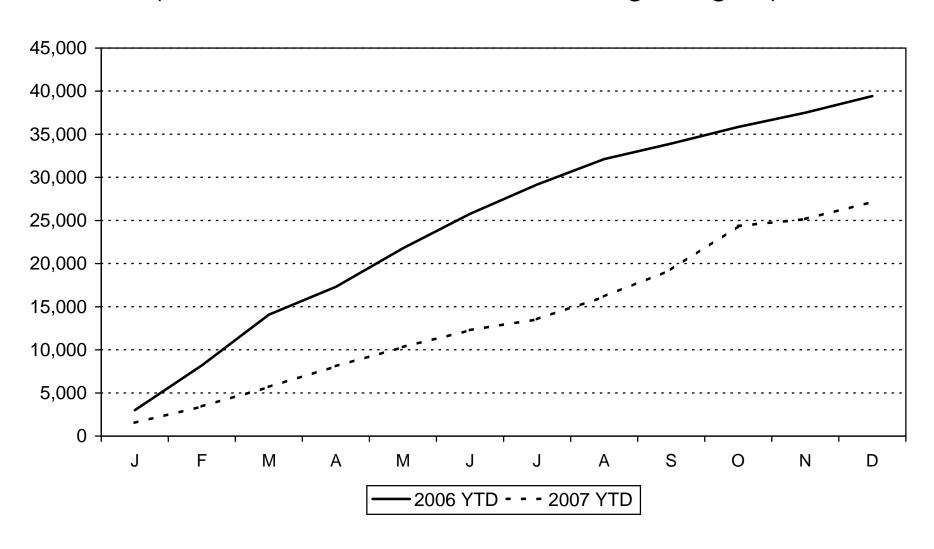

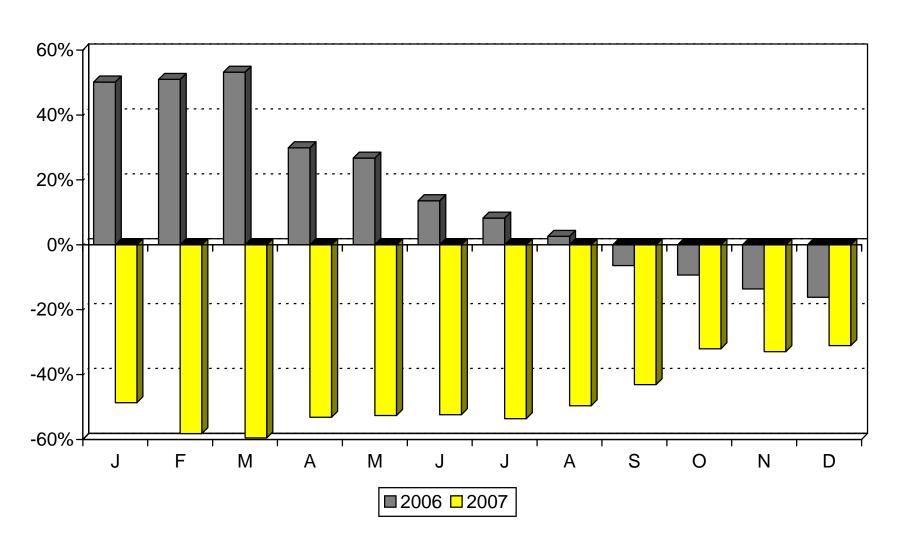

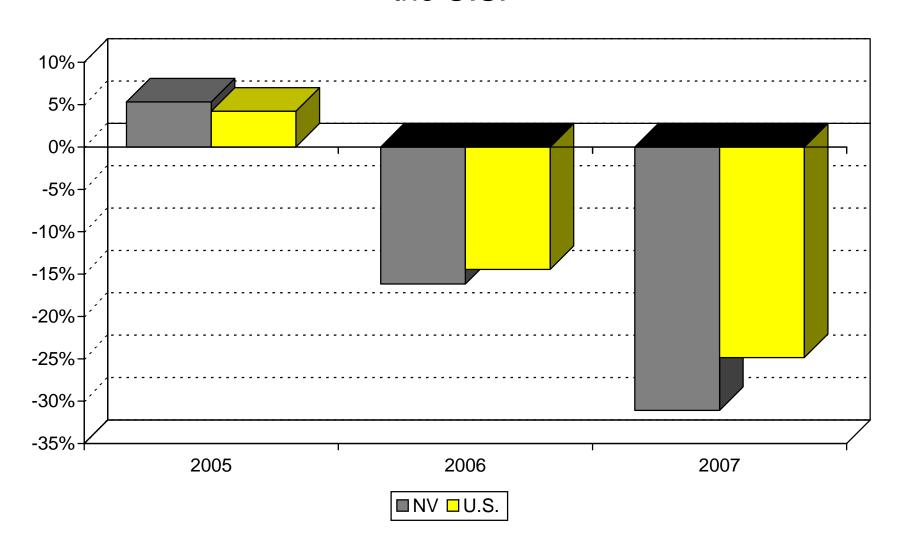
Nevada Residential Housing Permits (number of units; 2007 YTD through August)



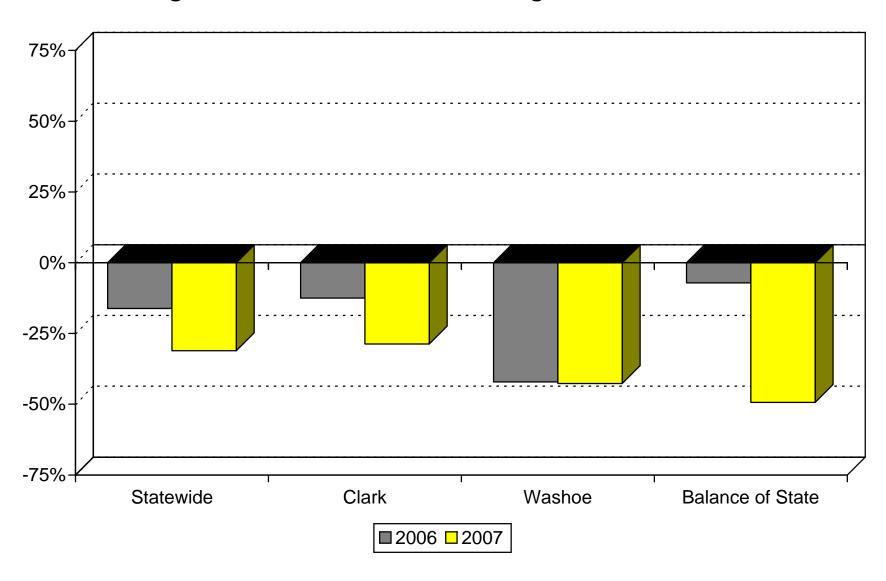
Nevada Residential Housing Permits: 2007 YTD vs. 2006 YTD

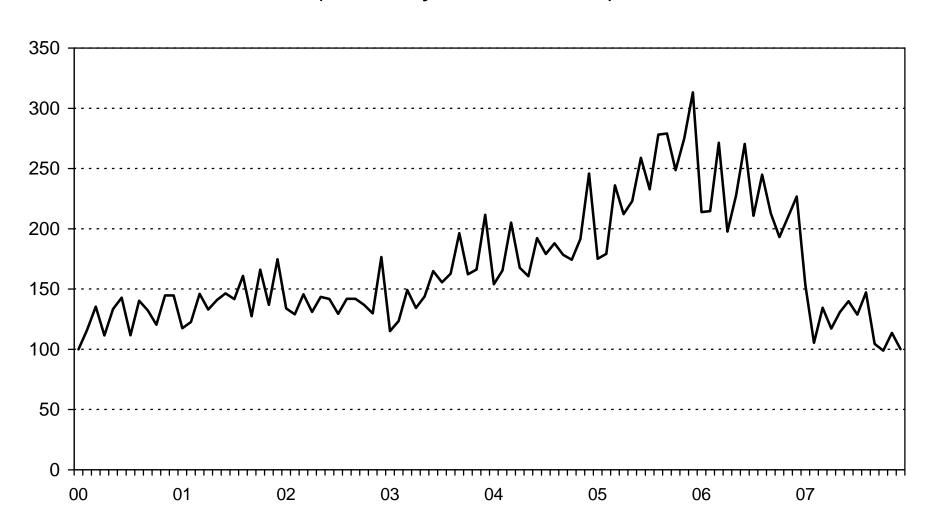

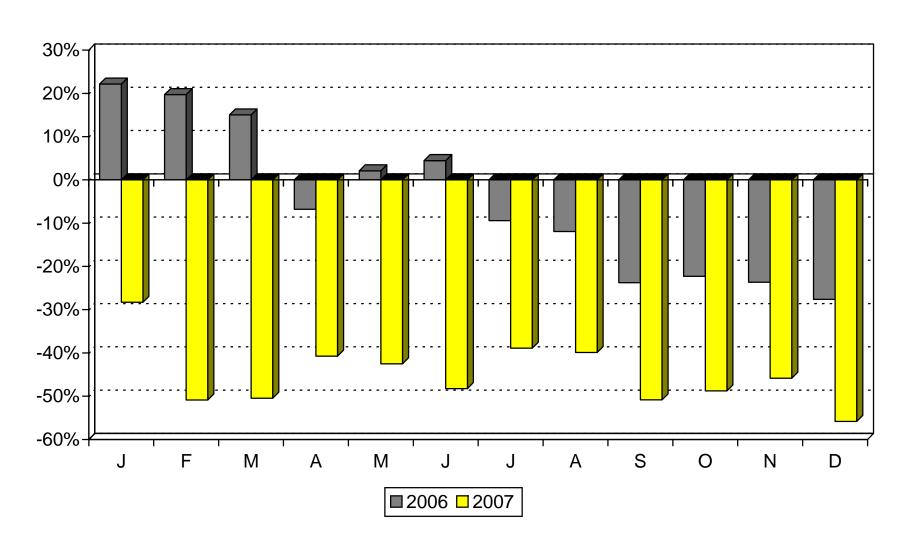

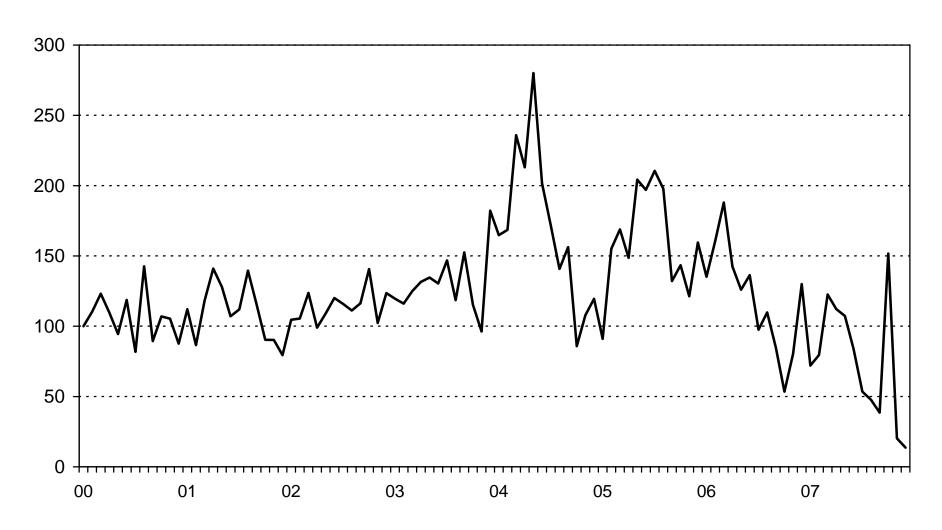
Southern Nevada New Home Closings (January 2000 = 100)



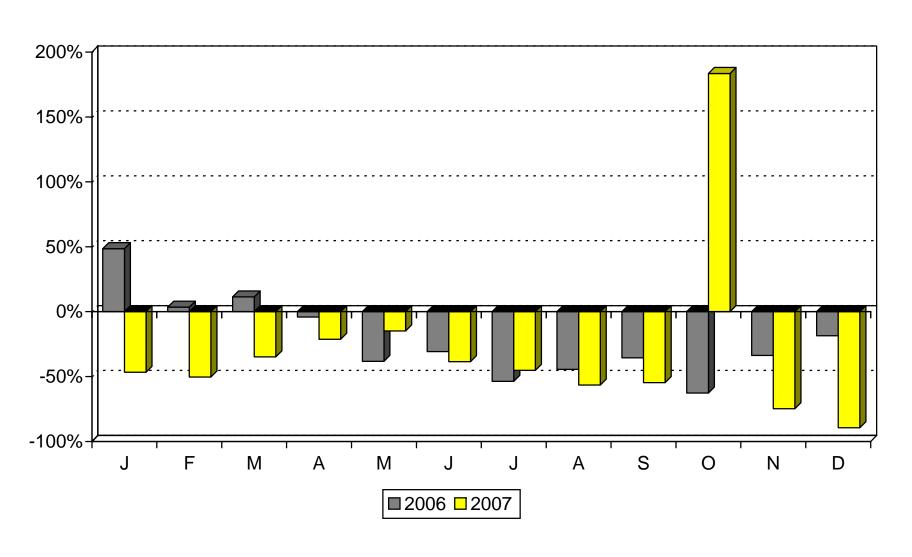
Southern Nevada New Home Closings Growth: 2007 vs. 2006



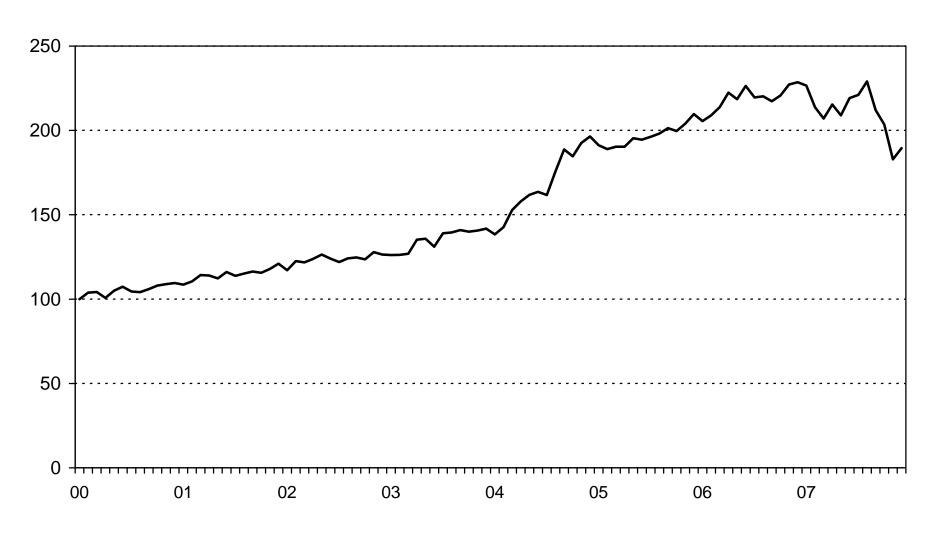
Southern Nevada New Home Permits (January 2000 = 100)



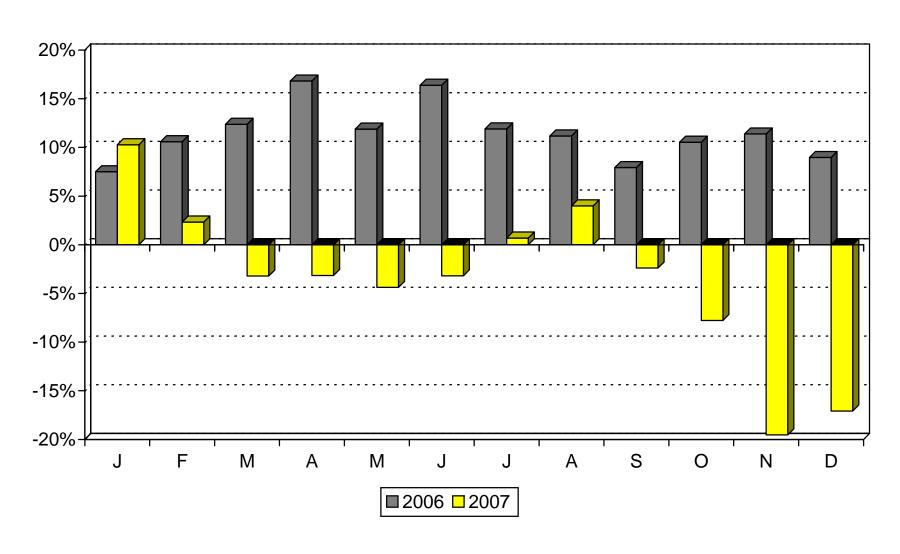
Southern Nevada New Home Permits Growth: 2007 vs. 2006
