INSTRUCTIONS:

To nominate a tract of forestland into Oregon's Forest Legacy Program (FLP), review these instructions and complete this project proposal. Please refer to the Oregon Department of Forestry's website, <u>www.oregon.gov/ODF</u>, to ensure your project is in a state Forest Legacy area, it will conserve a priority forest type as listed in Oregon's Assessment of Need (AON) and that the project adequately addresses national ranking criteria. She will assure your proposal meets state and federal Forest Legacy criteria, and it addresses key factors that will be considered when rating proposals. Project Proposals are due August 29, 2008.

The proposal will be evaluated and prioritized for inclusion in the program based on the answers provided on this two-part proposal. Part I - FLP Project Nomination Form; and Part II - Project Brief. The project brief should reflect the Goals of the Forest Legacy Program found in Oregon's Assessment of Need (see the website), as well as address the national criteria found in the Project Brief form.

Use Microsoft Word software to fill out the Project Nomination Form and Project Brief. Map(s) and photo(s) are required as part of the proposal, and should show the Tract, Project Area, adjacent ownership, conservation benefits, threats, emphasize strategic importance, and identify any adjacent landscape conservation planning efforts.

Tract: Parcel(s) or area(s) being considered for inclusion in the FLP in FY 2010. Interest in land to be purchased in the FY 2010 FLP funding request.

Project Area: Describe if current tract (request for federal funding) is a part of a larger landscape conservation strategy or project that may require phases and/or multiple sources of funding to complete.
