Upland cotton sales for delivery in MY 1998/99 during January 7 - January 28, 1999 (3 weeks) registered net sales of 46,500 running bales, a weekly average of 15,500 bales. In MY 1997/98, Upland sales during January 2 - January 29, 1998 (4 weeks) registered a net of 401,600 running bales, a weekly average of 100,400 bales. The weekly upland export average through January 28 for MY 1998/99 was 98,000 running bales against MY 1997/98's weekly export average of 114,000 running bales. Accumulated exports through January 28 for MY 1998/99 were 2.55 million compared with 2.97 million running bales last year. Total upland outstanding sales for MY 1998/99 were 1.02 million running bales compared with 3.39 million the same time a year ago. Upland commitments to date were 3.57 million bales compared with 6.36 million bales last year. Pima export sales during January 7 - January 28 for delivery during MY 1998/99 totaled 40,000 running bales and total net sales were 13,300 running bales. Pima exports through January 28 for MY 1998/99 totaled 97,000 running bales, compared with 184,500 running bales from the same time a year ago. Total Pima commitments amounted to 242,300 running bales.
