# New York State Guidebook



#### Dear Veteran,

As you approach your release we hope that the information included in this booklet will be of assistance to you. We have included a selection of basic services and programs to help you transition into the community. However, we strongly recommend that you make contact with the Department of Veterans Affairs Incarcerated Veteran Outreach Team prior to your release for information and assistance in identifying which programs would best meet your needs. The Incarcerated Veteran Outreach team can be reached through DOCS facilities transitional services. The Incarcerated Veteran Outreach Team is also the most direct resource for accessing the continuum of services within the VA.

New York State is divided into two networks for VA purposes. Network 2 is Upstate New York. Network 3 is Downstate New York. If you are going to locate south of Kingston, please contact the VA Network 3 Incarcerated Veteran Outreach Coordinator. If you intend to live upstate, North of Albany contact the Coordinator in the area you are going to. They are listed on page 3. If you are unsure please feel free to contact any of the VA staff identified in the brochure.

There are many resources available to veterans in New York State. The US Department of Veterans Affairs can provide services to eligible veterans – those with Honorable discharges. However, there is a range of services available to veterans without an honorable discharge provided by non-profit organizations which include but are not limited to emergency shelter, housing placement and help in finding employment.

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#### The Incarcerated Veteran Outreach Team:

The Incarcerated Veteran Outreach Team of the US Department of Veterans Affairs visits incarcerated veterans in correctional facilities in an effort to link these veterans to VA services on release. The team determines if veterans are eligible for VA services then partners with NYS Department of Corrections (DOCS) and NYS Division of Parole staff to develop release plans that include the services offered by the VA. The team also works with recently released veterans to facilitate their access to VA services. The Incarcerated Veteran Outreach Team acts as a liaison between DOCS and Parole staff and the continuum of VA services, many of which will be described in this brochure. For best results in accessing these services you should contact the Incarcerated Veteran Outreach Team approximately 6 months before your earliest possible release date. This will give the team enough time to determine your eligibility and work with you to develop a community transition plan. You can reach the Incarcerated Veteran Outreach team through DOCS transitional services.

#### **VETERAN'S HEALTH ADMINISTRATION REHABILITATION PROGRAMS**

#### **Health Care for Homeless Veterans Programs**

These programs provide outreach and a range of services designed to help veterans get back on their feet. Case management, psycho-educational programming and development of healthy supports are the cornerstones of these programs. In addition, eligible veterans receive assistance in obtaining housing, expediting SSI/SSD and VA benefits and securing entry into other VA programs. When you contact the VA Homeless Program you will receive assistance in accessing other VA services.

# Veteran's Industries

These programs help you transition to a job after your release, providing a short term supportive work experience at local VA Medical Centers or supervised in the community. You work-full-time and earn at least minimum wage, and also get assistance with resumes, job leads in the community and help with other barriers that make it hard for you to get a job.

#### **Domiciliaries**

These short-term residential programs provide comprehensive rehabilitation services. The focus is on developing the skills necessary for homeless veterans to lead productive and independent lives. There is an emphasis on relapse prevention and learning personal responsibility. The program uses a variety of treatment modalities including skills attainment workshops, group and individual counseling.

#### **Grant and Per Diem Transitional Housing**

The VA partners with community agencies to provide transitional housing to homeless veterans. Veterans pay up to 30% of their income and can reside in this housing for up to two years provided they participate in appropriate health care treatment and actively plan for fully independent community living. These programs are located in numerous communities throughout the state, but have varied admission criteria. For more information, contact the Homeless Coordinator in your area. They are listed on page 3.

#### **Post Traumatic Stress Disorder**

There are both residential and outpatient services available for veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Similar to our domiciliaries, our residential PTSD services offer an intensive therapeutic experience in a structured environment. Some of our facilities offer residential treatment for noncombat related PTSD and specialized programming for women vets with PTSD.

#### **Substance Abuse Treatment**

There are both residential and outpatient services available for veterans in need of substance abuse treatment. We strongly recommend that veterans with histories of substance abuse who have not received previous treatment avail themselves to this service prior to embarking on housing and job searches.

#### Women's Health Services

All of our medical centers have a woman's health manager to assist women veterans in accessing gender specific services. In addition to medical care, several of our facilities offer specialized psychosocial rehabilitation services for women including assistance with housing placement. Each of our facilities offers confidential Military Sexual Trauma (MST) services provided by trained counselors.

#### **Primary Medical and General Health Care**

We strongly encourage all eligible veterans to enroll in our primary care clinics and to speak to any of our health care providers about any health concerns you have that may require specialty care services.

There is AA and NA on site as well as shower facilities, a lunch services, a fitness center and a Social Security initiative.
