Course Description

The Intermediate Injury Prevention course is the second in a series of three short courses developed by IHS. This 4-day course will expand upon the knowledge and skills gained in the Introduction to Injury Prevention course and is a prerequisite for the IHS Injury Prevention Fellowship program. The purpose of this course is to increase the participant's knowledge and skills about how to effectively use data in injury prevention efforts. This course will consist of mini-lectures, case studies, skill-building exercises, and small and large group discussions. Participants are encouraged to share their experiences in injury prevention.
