Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA Project WVGS has started a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS 1. Go to the State Library URL at: http://oregon. gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml 2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left. 3. Click on Genealogy Research on the left. 3. Click on WVGS DNA Project 4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page. 5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form 6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen 7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one test. You will receive a confirmation in your email box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can or- der the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However, you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed. Questions? More information on Genetic Genealogy can be found at the following website by linking to its various pages (Click LEARN on the right side of the page): www.familytreedna.com	DNA Tests Find Branches but Few Roots By RON NIXON Published: November 25, 2007 in The New York Times HENRY LOUIS GATES JR., whose PBS special "African American Lives" explores the ancestry of famous African-Americans using DNA testing, has done more than anyone to help popularize such tests and companies that offer them. But recently this Harvard professor has become one of the in- dustry's critics. Mr. Gates says his concerns date back to 2000, when a company told him his maternal ancestry could most likely be traced back to Egypt, proba- bly to the Nubian ethnic group. Five years later, however, a test by a second company startled him. It concluded that his maternal ancestors were not Nubian or even African, but most likely European. Why the completely different results? Mr. Gates said the first company never told him he had mul- tiple genetic matches, most of them in Europe. November Program

The November program was presented by **Max Marbles**, professional bookbinder and conservator from the **Mission Mill**. He presented an excellent program on types of old photographs, dating photographs and scanning and fixing up old photos.

The oldest photographs are **Daguerreotypes**, from about 1839 to 1859. They are crystal clear, often found in cases. **Ambrotypes**, 1854 to the end of the Civil War, were similar to daguerreotypes, but exposed on glass. **CDV's (cartes de visite) and tintypes** were generally from 1859 to the 1890's. They were the first reproducible photos. CDV's were printed on paper. Tintypes were more durable, cheap, popular at State Fairs, and are generally sharp but dark. **Cabinet portraits** started in the 1870's until the Brownie camera came out in 1897 and changed things.

Dating old photos is done by knowing the type of photo that it is and when those were produced. When dating photos, look at the dress style. There are many books showing when styles were popular. Look at hair style, backdrop, posing style, furniture style, props, and borders. Also taxes were levied on photographs to help fund the Civil War and stamps affixed to the photographs can help date them.

The last topic Max addressed briefly was scanning in photographs yourself and fixing them up. Paint Shop Pro is relatively cheap and can do a lot. Various editions of Adobe Photoshop can do just about anything you want, but do take practice.

As with all topics nowadays, you can find many websites that assist in dating old photographs. Max is available at the Mission Mill to answer your questions. WVGS Newsletter
