Our Speaker for Saturday, February 9th, will be Connie Lenzen, from Portland, speaking on "Find Your Overland Trail Ancestor in Oregon and Washington Repositories". Connie is a Certified Genealogist, certified by the Board for Certification of Genealogists (BCG) in Washington, D.C. and is the current BCG president. **"Find Your Overland Trail Ancestor in Oregon and Washington Repositories"** will cover topics like Oregon Trail background, local repositories, manuscript collections, Internet research. **Connie** also has experience in searching for Immigrant Roots, how to tie together shreds of evidence gathered from family traditions, censuses, vital records, immigration and naturalization records, local histories, and religious records. This will be a program of interest to everyone, even if you don't have an Oregon Trail ancestor.

Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA Project WVGS has started a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS 1. Go to the State Library URL at: http://oregon. gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml 2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left. 3. Click on WVGS DNA Project 4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page. 5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form 6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen 7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one test. You will receive a confirmation in your email box tha your order was taken. Remember: Only men can or der the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 3' marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on olde ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However, you may wisi to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both th HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will giv you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again you can start small and upgrade, if needed. Questions? You are not charged until you send in your test kit. You can do the DNA testing through WVGS and submit it to other groups. <	after he retired, and has been a member of WVGS since 1996. He was "very loosely" interested in genealogy be- fore, but mostly just curious about his heritage. He now knows he is probably English, some Scotch, Danish and German. He has made trips to New York and to Germany and Denmark to do genealogical research. He doesn't do much Oregon research as his family came to Oregon late, in 1946. George says he was always interested in history and as the saying goes "you might be a historian and not a gene- alogist, but you can't be a genealogist and not a historian". You need to know the big picture which history reveals in why people moved and did the things they did, our family genealogy is the small picture. For patrons who come in and are just starting their re- search, George starts them with the pedigree charts that we have available. Everyone has unique family questions and we help with historical questions as well as genealogical. You can find a hint sometimes in one state that leads to another. One item that helped George was a Pension Application from an ancestor who served in the War of 1812. It is a forgotten war and pensions were not available until the 1850s when many of the men who served were already deceased. He found a complete history of where the fam- ily had lived, giving valuable information. And small in- teresting facts like the soldiers only served 3 weeks be- cause they voted that they didn't sign up to invade Canada, only to fight the British, so disbanded and went home! Pension lists are available at the library and on ances- try.com but the complete file is in the National Archives.

World Vital Records

Jim Willhite has upgraded the World Vital Records account that is on the OSL computer at the Reference Desk to include the enlarged collection. The World Collection has more than a billion names that are being indexed and made available online as quickly as possible. We have licensed this diverse collection of extremely valuable content from over 20 content providers from all around the world. We are in negotiations to add even more high quality and valuable data. The value of both our US and World collections will continue to increase every day as we add more databases. Some of the Key Data in the WorldVitalRecords.com World collection: United Kingdom Censuses and Birth, Marriage, and Death Records - Includes searchable censuses from 1841, 1861, 1871, and 1891, war deaths, parish registers and civil registrations. The UK census for 1851, 1881, and 1901 will also be available soon as part of the World Collection.
