Our June WVGS meeting will feature the renown Susan Niggli, who will be speaking about special resources available at the Oregon State Library. These resources will specifically include special Periodical Magazines from various states and Native American resources available for the interested genealogist. Periodicals are magazines published from each state in the union and they address historically significant issues from those states that might be of interest to the researcher. Articles may include what was going on back in time such as how pioneers built adobe or log cabins, it may talk about a special event that occurred such as a lunar eclipse or a moment when the French General, Marquise de Lafayette gave a speech as he toured the United States trying to earn money to help fight the British. The ideas on articles are endless but sure to capture our members interest.

OSL Volunteers are frequently receiving inquiries regarding Native American resources in the library. **Susan** will provide insight into what books and ledgers are available on the shelves to help those interested in their Indian history.

Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA <u>Project</u>

WVGS has started a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS...

- 1. Go to the State Library URL at: http://oregon. gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml
- 2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
- 3. Click on WVGS DNA Project
- 4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form
- 6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen
- 7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one test.

You will receive a confirmation in your email box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However, you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

<u>Bob Baldwin</u>

Bob Baldwin has been a volunteer for 2 years on Tuesday afternoons. His genealogy research began over 35 years ago. He has made many trips in the US to visit every location where his ancestors lived and has photos of all of his grandparents, great-grandparents and greatgreat-grandparents. During his two and a half month trip he visited 10 locations. **Bob** has researched his grandparents back to 1581 and 1287. His ancestry is English, Swedish, German, Irish and Dutch. His Baldwin family goes back to John Baldwin who landed in 1638 and lived in Boston. In 2000, **Bob** visited the site of a family log cabin in Chautauqua, NY and did an archeological dig.

Volunteering at the OSL good place to follow your passion, according to **Bob.** He is almost ready to write a book about his family, but always comes home from a trip with more information. If you are just starting, he says to start with interviewing family members now. Take pictures of them, collect copies of pictures that they have and you may be able to get information from family who actually knew your great-grandparents.

His biggest help at OSL has been **Susie Niggli**, who he volunteers with now and who helped him out 20 years with a brick wall. Periodicals at the library are excellent for filling in the history of the period and locale, as well as providing anecdotes. The books and periodicals at the OSL have helped with research in localities other than Oregon. Military books have help him join **SAR** (Sons of the American Revolution).

Greetings everyone! As you may recall, I put out a plea for all of you to join the fight for GINA (Genetic Information and Nondiscrimination Act) a few months ago. I again posted to you when the bill was finally passed in the Senate. At last Pres. Bush has signed it, and I wanted all of you to know. This law protects all of us from discrimination by insurance companies and employers when we acquire (or our doctors acquire) knowledge of harmful mutations in our DNA which can give us the LIKELIHOOD of a disease. Remember, just because we have the marker for the disease doesn't mean we get it.

I also wanted to thank those of you who participated in sending emails to your Senators and to Tom Coburn and Harry Reid. A special thanks to Katherine Borges, the director of ISOGG (International Society of Genetic Genealogists) who created the GINA Contest to get us involved! Kudos, K.!!!!

<u>May Program</u>

Gerald Lenzen was the speaker for the May Program. He showed us the trail he used to find his greatgrandfather's birth place in Germany. He worked backwards using census records, birth and marriage records, maps, and land records. He faced the common problem of variant name spellings, inaccurate information, and the German practice of having a saint or family name for the first name, but using the middle name. A recommended book is the series "Atlantic Bridge to Germany" to help locate your ancestors in Germany. You have to know where they were from. In Germany, old records are in regional archives, Catholic, Lutheran and Civil records. Gerald gave a very interesting story on his research, with many hints to help others.

Family Association Newsletters: family name newsletters housed at OSL

Genealogy Periodicals Available: Complete list of periodicals available at the Oregon State Library

Resources at the State Library continued:

Master File of Genealogy Resources on Microfilm: The contents of the microfilm in the large cabinets in the back of the Microfilm room is now available on the WVGS website. The (pink) book "Contents of the File Drawers in the Microfilm Room", surveyed by Linda (Guthrie) Doran has been scanned in and can be viewed on line. The cabinet contains microfilm on vital records, Oregon families, history and newspaper, census records, and a variety of other genealogical topics.

WVGS Constitution and Standing Rules Review

The Executive Board is currently reviewing the WVGS Constitution and Standing Rules. The following changes have been proposed by the Board. All proposed changes will be voted on at one time when we have published all the proposed changes.

Proposed changes to WVGS Constitution and Standing Rules:

1. Issue: we currently are pro-rating dues. Constitution (page 1)

ARTICLE III <u>MEMBERSHIP</u>

Section 2 The membership year shall be from January first through December thirty-first.

Proposed change:

Section 2 The membership year shall be from January first through December thirty- first. *Dues will be prorated for members joining after March* 31st.

Standing Rules (page 8) ARTICLE VIII <u>MEMBERSHIP RECORDS, POLICIES</u>

Section 2 Membership Policies

B. The membership year is from January 1 through December 31. Dues shall not be prorated for part of the year.

Proposed change:

Section 2 Membership Policies:

B. The membership year is from January 1 through December 31. Dues shall be prorated as follows: members joining April 1st through June 30 pay ³/₄ of annual dues, members joining July 1st through September 30th pay ¹/₂ of annual dues, and members joining October 1st through December 31st pay ¹/₄ of annual dues. (the remainder of paragraph to remain the same)

2. Issue: we change the date of our meeting, not the place, if there is a conflict. Standing Rules (page 5)

ARTICLE V MEETINGS QUORUMS

Section 1 The regular general membership meetings of the Society shall be held on the second Saturday of each month at the Oregon State Library. The hours shall be 10:00 am. to 4:00 p.m. Should the Oregon State Library be temporarily unavailable for any reason, WVGS shall be responsible for arranging for a different meeting site.
