## Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA Project

WVGS has started a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS...

- 1. Go to the State Library URL at: http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml
- 2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
- 3. Click on WVGS DNA Project
- 4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form
- 6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen
- 7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one test.

You will receive a confirmation in your email box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However, you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

The DNA Project is open to anyone, not just WVGS members. You are not charged until you send in your test kit. You can do the DNA testing through WVGS and submit it to other groups.

### **Cliff Butler**

**Cliff Butler** is a Genealogy Volunteer at the OSL on Tuesdays. Cliff has been volunteering for more than 10 years, after he joined WVGS. It is a chance to work on your own genealogy as well as meeting interesting people who are working on their family histories.

Cliff published a book last year on his **Butler** family. Most of his family was started in Virginia, then to Georgia, Kentucky, Missouri and Texas. He did find after publishing that a great-aunt did come to Oregon. His ancestors were early settlers of Texas when it was a republic. Butlers can also be traced back to Ireland in the early 1300s. Family research has been a good reason to make two trips to Ireland to visit the two Butler castles.

Publishing a book was a good experience. Cliff learned a lot about the process and what works and doesn't work. A good technical writer is needed to put it into a good format, MS Word to pdf, to a CD. Have your work in a format that can't be changed— 4 places messed it up! Go to at least 3 places to get estimates (not color). More copies cost less, of course, but for 200+ pages, including shipping, would be about \$45. He didn't have it bound so that people could add their own information to it.

For people visiting the Library, Cliff says to be sure to bring your own pedigree charts, be organized and if possible use the Oregon State Library catalog on the internet before you come. We have lots of books and CDs, family histories, periodicals, and a volunteer to give advice. We help but don't do the research for you. We have volunteers with experience in researching certain states and countries, so different people may be able to help you.

This is of paramount importance and I know that most of us do not like to write

our

representatives, but this is our only voice in this matter and as all of you have shown an interest in DNA testing for genealogy, this can directly affect you. If the bill doesn't pass, many people will hear about it and hesitate to DNA test. We all know what that means. I urge you to help by writing your representatives. I urge you to share this with others who are interested in DNA Testing. I urge you to share this will all friends and family as it will affect them

# WVGS LIBRARY REPORT FOR MARCH NEWSLETTER By Jim Willhite PEDIGREE CHARTS

Are you aware WVGS has a collection of Pedigree Charts of a good number of past and present members? Before the likes of Ancestry.com, Pedigree Charts were used by members and nonmembers to find others researching the same surnames. Their importance is emphasized in Section 5 A. of the Standing Rules of our organization. To paraphrase them "Members shall be encouraged either to submit a Nine-Generation Pedigree Chart with a set of surname cards... or to submit computer-generated charts and surname information."

WVGS provides the surname cards and also has available fifteen-generation charts for sale along with the nine-generation charts. Each chart and each surname card and the name list should include your name and membership number along with as much vital information you have on each ancestor. Non-member charts are accepted and coded into the system with assigned identification numbers.

A number of years ago the WVGS card file names were made into an easy to use alphabetical data file that is kept in a large notebook in the WVGS section of the stacks and brought out usually on meeting day along with the pedigree charts. The information from newly submitted surname cards is entered into the surname data file and the cards are filed with others in the section in the alcove. Likewise for those who submit a computer generated chart and list of surnames on the chart (an ahnentafel), the names are added to the surname data file and the list of names is filed along with the chart in the computer generated chart notebook. If you have any questions please contact the Pedigree Chart chairman, currently Jim Willhite.

### **Oregon State Library Surname Files**

Another place to check for possible information on the surnames you are researching. The Oregon State Library collection of surname periodicals, newsletters, and other file materials have been moved from the stacks to a new location in the back of the microfilm room where the 2<sup>nd</sup> copier used to be. The file cabinets were provided courtesy of OSL and the immense job of moving the material

was done by volunteer Linda Doran. Our thanks for all her efforts.

The Handbook will contain information for volunteers about Oregon State Library procedures, WVGS information, general genealogy help suggestions for patrons, specific suggestions for researchers answering the most common research questions and what is available at the Library, and other off-site research help, both on the internet and at other sites.

There will be two notebooks so that one can be checked out by new volunteers. The notebook will be gone over at the next Volunteer Training, probably in May.

# The Genealogical Council of Oregon Conference

The Genealogical Council of Oregon will be sponsoring a conference, "Online and Onsite", on July 19, 2008 at Lane Community College in Eugene, Oregon. The featured speaker will be Cyndi Howells of Cyndi's **List. Plus:** "Ask the Experts", free Ancestry.com access, luncheon speaker from FamilySearch Indexing, six other genealogical presentations, and vendor and society booths. ### January Program

The January program speaker was **Karen Harless**, talking about her product, **Heritage Makers.** It is an on-line program of storybooking to include stories, pictures, mementos, calendars, cards and more. You don't have to buy software. You can work on their program on-line, upload your pictures and then they publish a book.

The basic program is no charge, and the next level there are more templates and embellishments available. The company archives your product so if you need more you can order more later. A standard 5" by 5", 21 page book costs \$35 for example. Books are expandable to 99 pages. A calendar would cost \$40. Karen lives in Keizer and can be contacted at JKPhotoLegacy.com.

### February Program

The February program was "Research Your Overland Trail Ancestor in Oregon & Washington Repositories" by Connie Lenzen. Connie provided some background on the Oregon Trail, approximately 2000 miles from St. Louis, Missouri to Oregon. In 1840 there were 13 immigrants, the 1845 Census reported less than 3,000 inhabitants, 1850 Census had a total of 13,000 people in Oregon and in 1852 alone there were 10,000 immigrants.

Connie talked about the types of sources, original or derivative and whether information if primary or secondary, as well as the Genealogical Proof Standard.

Oregon Donation Land Claims are on microfilm at the National Archives (see the flyer on page 9 of this newsletter), but are also at the Genealogical Forum of Oregon in Portland.

The Oregon State Library has a good collection of books and films pertaining to Oregon Trail Immigrants. Evelyn Gatlin just recently finished compiling a list of materials available at the OSL. Other repositories along the I-5 corridor:
