

## **Advanced Injury Prevention Course**

## **Course Description**

This course builds upon your knowledge and skills of applying public health practices to injury prevention. The course addresses the principles of effective injury prevention through a combination of interactive presentations, computer labs, case histories, and group exercises. Emphasis is placed on the following core injury prevention program topics:

- Using data to drive policy and change
- Data analysis techniques
- Developing a sustainable program
- Strategic planning for local programs
- Effective strategies in intentional injury
- Injury prevention through home visits
- Strategies in reporting accomplishments
- Advocacy strategies
- Developing public information materials
- Working with the media
- Funding community IP projects

## **Course Objectives**

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Develop short- and long-term Injury Prevention Program strategic plans.
- Develop injury prevention reports and presentations.
- Develop an Injury Prevention Program budget.
- Collaborate with media outlets to promote an Injury Prevention Program.
