What is this project about?


- The PEIS will examine the foreseeable environmental impacts of geothermal leasing and associated development on BLM and FS lands with moderate to high potential for geothermal resources in twelve western states including Alaska.
- The PEIS will also analyze the potential impacts of issuing pending lease applications that were filed before January 1, 2005.


Why are we having these scoping meetings?

We need your help!


With your help, we will be able to:

- (2) Identify your concerns early in the process so they can be addressed in the PEIS






Indirect Use: Electricity Generation

Carbon Dioxide emissions range from 0 - 4% per megawatt of the CO₂ emitted by a fossil fuel power plant.

The NEPA Process

NEPA: National Environmental Policy Act

The PEIS will:

- Analyze impacts from geothermal leasing and associated development
 - direct, indirect and cumulative impacts
- Serve as a tiering document for subsequent, site-specific NEPA documentation, as needed

The NEPA Process

Assess impacts to natural and human environment, including:

- Tribal interests
- Air quality
- Water resources and water quality
- Land uses, including recreation and agriculture
- Cultural resources
- Biological resources
- Socioeconomic conditions
