

## I-5: Homestead to S. Gold Hill, Bundle 313 Region 3

## **Notice of Subcontracting Opportunities**

The Oregon Department of Transportation is planning a bridge construction project in Jackson County within the next 30 days.

I-5: Homestead to S. Gold Hill, Bundle 313, is part of ODOT's OTIA III State Bridge Delivery Program. The project consists of the repair of five bridges (08381N, 08381S, 08383N, 08383S and 07601B) located along Interstate 5 in Jackson County.

The cost of this project is estimated to be \$7.7 million. The anticipated construction bid let date is August 2008. It is estimated that construction will begin in September 2008 and be complete in January 2011.

Contracting and subcontracting opportunities are potentially available on Bundle 313. This list is for reference only, as neither ODOT nor any awarded contractor is obligated to subcontract these specific scopes of work.
