Whether you are new to the 41st Brigade family or have been around for a while, I look forward to the opportunity to support you and your family in any way possible.



The Oregon Army National Guard and the U. S. Army has many resources to meet the needs of the families of deployed Soldiers. We have access to all the traditional services which are common on an Active Duty installation, and many unique means to meet your needs. Some of these assets, like Military One Source (http://www.militaryonesource.com/skins/MOS/home.aspx) you may access yourself. We are here to assist with emergency issues which cannot be addresses through this self help website.

As the Commander of the Rear Detachment, my pledge to each of you is to do everything possible to keep you informed on what is going on with your Soldier. My staff and I will make every effort to assist you with any issues which may arise while your Soldier is deployed. In order for us to best address your needs, we ask that you bring the issues which require our attention to your unit Family Readiness Coordinator. They will then send them to Mrs. Laura Higgins, the Brigade Family Program Coordinator, whose office is located across the hall from mine.

We will log in your request for assistance, task it to the appropriate staff section and assign a reasonable suspense for when we should contact you with a solution. The Rear Detachment staff will then access the appropriate resource to meet the needs of you, your family, or your Soldier. We will reply to you as quickly as possible to provide the answer or required assistance.

Again, welcome to the Task Force Phoenix Family and let us know how we can assist you.

MISSISSIPPI LEAVE DATES

JAG's Corner

41 BCT Members, spouses and children are eligible for military legal assistance on a wide variety of legal issues. A JAG lawyer is available to brief deploying soldiers and their families as well as those soldiers and their families who are being demobilized.





To obtain assistance you may call 503-584-3571 or 800-452-7500 and ask for JAG. A JAG lawyer is available both at the Tigard Armory and the JFHQ Facility depending upon the day

of the week, and mission availability. Please call to make an appointment.

JAG assistance may include advice on family law issues including, marriage, divorce, adoption, and family support issues; free preparation of wills, powers of attorneys, health care directives and living wills; assistance on real property issues involving issues involved in buying, selling and financing your house, as well as assistance on landlord tenant issues, personal property advice including contracts and small claims issues, economic issues including debtor/creditor issues, civil administrative issues including advice on name change and immigration, advice on torts and taxes. It may include advice or referral on military Justice issues.

We work closely with the Family Support Coordinator, the Chaplain, and the ANA Cell to assist 41st BCT soldiers and their families as the deployment begins, during the deployment and upon the return home of the 41st BCT. Deploying Soldiers and their soldiers have special legal rights under federal and state law. The JAG may assist you in understanding and asserting your legal rights.

In addition the Oregon State Bar has a dedicated volunteer group of approximately 150 civilian attorney's state wide







Planning before departure to Afghanistan - 5 Helpful Hints

- 1. Go through and make sure all legal documents are in order. Do that now so that when your soldier comes home on leave, he can take care of anything that is missing before he leaves country, i.e. a Power of Attorney.
- 2. Please try your best to not watch the news. We know it's difficult but remember they are covering the entire country, possibly the whole Middle East area, and may not have information specifically on our soldiers. The Family Program Coordinators will keep you appraised as events unfold in country. If you don't know who your coordinator is yet, please call Laura Higgins.
- 3. Triwest Dental (United Concordia) insurance Remember that dental is not included with medical. You have to apply for United Concordia separately. You can do this on line at www.ucci.com.
- 4. The Department of Defense will never call you on the phone requesting your soldier's personal information, i.e. social security number, address, etc. Be very careful who you give information to on the phone. If you think about it, they should know that information but there are scams out there where people are calling families and saying they are with the DoD and want to verify personal information.

5. Notification.

- a. If a soldier is killed in action (KIA), the family will always be notified in person. You will never receive a phone call, an e-mail or a letter if something of that magnitude happens.
- b. However, if it's a very serious injury, it can come in two ways. You may get a phone call from your local unit as well as a visit from the military department, depending on the situation. You will not receive anything in the mail or e-mail.
 - c. In case of a light injury you can get as phone call from your local unit but it will probably be someone you know.

The important thing here is to understand the military policy on this subject. If you feel something isn't right, please call your coordinator. Deployments are stressful enough.
