Summary of Louisiana Energy Services Quarterly Management Meeting

Date: May 18, 2005

Place: U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) offices Rockville, MD

Attendees: See Attachment 1

Purpose:

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss project management issues applicable to the proposed Louisiana Energy Services (LES) gas centrifuge uranium enrichment plant project. The meeting agenda is in Attachment 2.

Discussion:

After introductions, Mr. Jack Strosnider, Director of the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards, summarized activities that have taken place since the last management meeting. These included meeting our schedule goals and resolving the remaining technical issues. In addition, LES transmitted Revisions 4 and 5 of its application last month and NRC staff is completing the preparation of its Safety Evaluation Report (SER) and Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) for the project. Mr. Strosnider indicated that NRC staff currently expects to meet our schedule of issuing these two documents by June 15, 2005. He also stated that he very much appreciates the LES cooperation and high quality submittals that were necessary for NRC to meet this goal.

Mr. Strosnider stated that the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board (ASLB) is scheduled to issue its decision on the four environmental contentions in early June and plans to begin the evidentiary portion hearing process on the technical contentions in late October. He indicated that the NRC staff objective is to support the timely hearing process as established by the Commission.

Mr. James Ferland, President and Chief Executive Officer of LES, provided introductory remarks indicating that he appreciates the cooperation LES has received and the efforts of NRC staff to meet the schedules.

Mr. James Clifford then discussed the current licensing status of the project stating that the project is currently on schedule and that staff expect to complete the SER and FEIS in June 2005. He also stated that NRC will be formally transmitting to LES later this week a draft of the SER for a factual accuracy check. He indicated that NRC staff would like this review to be completed within one week so that NRC schedules will not be delayed. Mr. Rod Krich of LES stated that he expects the LES review to be completed by May 25, 2005.

Mr. Clifford indicated that the primary technical issues have been resolved. However, there is a remaining outstanding item to verify a reference used in the natural gas pipeline explosion calculations. He also stated that NRC staff is waiting for an LES decision on whether it will place greater reliance on the use of the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) depleted uranium

disposition path. If LES desires to do this, it will need to provide additional supporting information and it could affect the completion schedule for the SER. Rod Krich indicated that he understood this and is working with DOE to determine if supporting information can be made available.

Ms. Jennifer Davis discussed the status of the FEIS development and indicated that it is on schedule. She also stated that over 4200 comments from over 400 individuals were provided on the draft EIS.

Ms. Lisa Clark discussed the hearing status and stated that there could be additional late-filed contentions after the FEIS and SER are issued. She said that an ASLB decision on those late-filed contentions, if any, would be made in August 2005. She stated that a decision on the four environmental contentions is scheduled to be made on June 3, 2005.

Mr. James Ferland then discussed the project from the LES perspective (see Attachment 3). He stated that he appreciates the effort made by the staff. He summarized the activities since the last management meeting and acknowledged the issues involving the natural gas pipeline hazard calculation and the decommissioning funding issue relating to the DOE depleted uranium disposition path.

Mr. Ferland indicated that the Shaw Group architect-engineer (Nuclear Technology Solutions) is fully on-board the project and design work is on schedule. He stated that LES is planning to begin construction in August 2006. Mr. Ferland also indicated that LES will begin financing discussions with banks beginning the week of May 23, 2005. He said that utilities are still communicating strong support for the project. He also mentioned that LES staff is working with NRC Region II staff to coordinate a trip to Almelo, The Netherlands, to discuss construction inspection issues.

NRC and LES staffs then discussed the need for future quarterly management meetings. Both staffs agreed that, with the issuance of the SER and FEIS, quarterly meetings may be unnecessary, but management meetings are still needed. It was then decided that a semi-annual meeting frequency would be a good balance of staff resources and meeting benefits. Both Mr. Ferland and Mr. Strosnider emphasized that at any time, if issues surface, those issues should be addressed without waiting for the next management meeting.
