

14. Description of Amendment/Modification:

The purpose of this modification is to accomplish the following:

- Delete Clause B.5 Determination of Award Fee Earned (Nov 2004) in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof the updated Clause B.5 Determination of Award Fee Earned (Dec 2006) included in this modification.
- Delete Clause H.19 Performance Evaluation Plan (Nov 2004) in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof the new Clause H.19 Performance Evaluation and Measurement Plan (Dec 2006) included in this modification.
- 3) Delete Clause C.1 Performance Work Statement in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof Attachment 1 to this modification. This revision of the Performance Work Statement (PWS) adds effort for the Cytogenetics Biodosymetry Laboratory and clarifies/expands the PWS description under the topic of Peer Review. Changes to the PWS are indicated by a vertical line on the left margin of the affected pages.
- 4) Delete Section J, Attachment A, Reporting Requirements in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof the updated Section J, Attachment A, Reporting Requirements which is Attachment 2 to this modification. This update revises the terminology in the last item from PEP to PEMP.
- 5) Delete Section J, Attachment C, Government Furnished Facilities in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof the updated Section J, Attachment C, Government Furnished Facilities which is Attachment 3 to this modification. This update deletes the Vance Road Facility and removes the note on SC-1 effort, which was completed in calendar year 2006.
- 6) Delete Section J, Attachment D, Requirements Change Notice ORAU-03 (18 pages) in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof Requirements Change Notice ORAU-04 (20 pages) which is Attachment 4 to this modification.
- Incorporate Section J, Attachment G, Special Financial Institution Account Agreement which
 is Attachment 5 to this modification. This attachment should have been included previously
 and was inadvertently overlooked.
- Correct the title of Clause I.108 in Modification M016 from 970.5227-2 Rights in Data Facilities to 970.5227-1 Rights in Data – Facilities.

Accordingly, the contract is hereby modified as follows:

 Clause B.5 Determination of Award Fee Earned (Nov 2004) is deleted in its entirety and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

B.5 DETERMINATION OF AWARD FEE EARNED (DEC 2006)

a) There shall be no annual negotiation of total available award fee since the total available award fee for the base period and the option period of the contract has been established. There shall be no adjustment in the amount of total available award fee by reason of differences between any estimate of cost for performance of the work under this contract and the actual costs for performance of that work. Total available award fee is subject to adjustment only under the provisions of the clause in Section I, FAR 52.243-2 entitled "Changes – Cost Reimbursement, Alternate I." The total available award fee shall be applicable to the prime Contractor and its members in a joint venture or teaming arrangement identified and considered a part of the selection and award of this contract, if any.

- b) The Government shall, at the conclusion of each specified evaluation period, evaluate the Contractor's performance for a determination of award fee amount in accordance with the clause in Section H entitled "Performance Evaluation and Measurement Plan." The determination as to the amount of award fee earned will be made by the Manager, Oak Ridge Office. The Contractor agrees that such determination is a unilateral determination made by the Manager, Oak Ridge Office. The Contractor shall be promptly advised in writing of the determination and the basis for the amount of award fee earned.
- c) In the event that the Contractor has failed to comply with contract terms and conditions relating to the safeguarding of Restricted Data or other classified information, or relating to the protection of worker safety and health, the Contractor's fee may be reduced. Any such reduction shall be in accordance with the clause in Section I, DEAR 952.223-76 entitled "Conditional Payment of Fee or Profit Safeguarding Restricted Data and Other Classified Information and Protection of Worker Safety and Health."
- d) Award fee earned shall be available for payment in accordance with the provisions of this clause and the clause in Section G entitled "Payment of Base Fee and Award Fee." Award fee not earned during the evaluation period shall not be allocated to future evaluation periods.
- Clause H.19 Performance Evaluation Plan (Nov 2004) is deleted in its entirety and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

H.19 PERFORMANCE EVALUATION AND MEASUREMENT PLAN (DEC 2006)

Prior to the beginning of each evaluation period, the Government will establish a Contractor Performance Evaluation and Measurement Plan to serve as the primary, but not sole, means for assessment of Contractor performance upon which the determination of award fee shall be based. The Plan will outline the methodology by which the total available fee amount will be allocated and the amount earned determined. The Plan may be revised unilaterally by the Government during the period of performance.

The Government shall establish Performance Goals responsive to the Performance Expectations established in the clause in Section H entitled "Performance Expectations." The Plan will include Performance Objectives to be assessed in evaluating the Performance Goals. The Performance Objectives will be limited in number and focus on results to drive improved performance and increased effective and efficient management of the Contractor.

A copy of the Plan shall be provided to the Contractor 15 days prior to the start of the evaluation period. Within 30 days after the end of the evaluation period, the Contractor shall submit a self-evaluation of performance which may be given such consideration, if any, as the Government may find appropriate in assessing Contractor performance. The self-evaluation shall include an overall summary of performance; performance ratings for each Performance Objective and the Contractor overall; and a summary of key strengths and weaknesses related to the Contractor's performance. Where deficiencies in performance are noted, the Contractor shall describe the actions planned or taken to correct such deficiencies and avoid their recurrence.

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- Delete Clause C.1 Performance Work Statement in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof Attachment 1 to this modification.
- 4. Delete Section J, Attachment A, Reporting Requirements in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof the updated Section J, Attachment A, Reporting Requirements which is Attachment 2 to this modification.
- Delete Section J. Attachment C, Government Furnished Facilities, in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof the updated Section J, Attachment C, Government Furnished Facilities which is Attachment 3 to this modification.
- Delete Section J, Attachment D, Requirements Change Notice ORAU-03 (18 pages) in its entirety, substituting in lieu thereof Requirements Change Notice ORAU-04 (20 pages) which is Attachment 4 to this modification.
- 7. Incorporate Section J, Attachment G, Special Financial Institution Account Agreement which is Attachment 5 to this modification.
- 8. Correct the title of Clause I.108 in Modification M016 from 970.5227-2 Rights in Data Facilities to 970.5227-1 Rights in Data Facilities.

Contractor's Statement of Release

In consideration of the modification agreed to herein as a complete and equitable adjustment, the Contractor hereby releases the Government from any and all liability under this contract for further equitable adjustments attributable to changes implemented as a result of this modification. There is no increase or decrease in the estimated cost of, or time required for performance of any part of the work under this contract.

All other terms and conditions remain unchanged.

C.1 PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT (JAN 2007)

1.0 SCOPE

The Contractor shall manage and direct programs of the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education (ORISE), an organization responsible for promoting a broad spectrum of programmatic activities that are supportive of the DOE mission. The Contractor provides technical and program management services to DOE, and also conducts reimbursable work for other Federal and non-Federal entities in accordance with applicable Federal statute, such as Section 33 of the Atomic Energy Act and the Economy Act, in the areas of science and education and maintains certain research, training, educational, and support facilities provided by the Government and/or Contractor. The primary activities include:

- 1. Illness and injury surveillance
- 2. Independent environmental assessment and verification
- 3. Radiation accident management
- National security and emergency management
- 5. Professional and technical training
- 6. Science education programs
- 7. Scientific and technical resource integration

This Performance Work Statement reflects the Contractor's responsibility to develop and implement innovative approaches and adopt practices to foster continuous improvement in accomplishing ORISE's mission. ORISE programs are carried out in conjunction with academia, other DOE facilities, and other Government agencies and are performed in Government and /or Contractor facilities principally located in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The Contractor provides integrated line management of multiple programs with the appropriate resources and support to assure delivery in the most cost effective manner.

Specific tasks to be performed by the Contractor in supporting the Performance Work Statement objectives will be assigned in accordance with the requirements of the clause in Section H entitled "Work Authorization Control System."

Performance expectations encompassing the Performance Work Statement are categorized in the clause in Section H entitled "Performance Expectations," and will be utilized by the DOE as a means for evaluating and improving Contractor performance.

2.0 PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this performance-based contract is to provide management and direction of programs through ORISE that maintain and advance science and education capabilities supporting DOE's strategic goals in the areas of defense,

energy, science, and the environment. The contract objectives and activities include, but are not limited to, the following:

2.1 <u>Illness and injury surveillance</u> – Provide DOE and the scientific community with important information on the long-term health outcomes of current and former workers.

Surveillance of the health of current DOE workers and former DOE beryllium vendor employees through the systematic collection, analysis, and interpretation of data; maintenance of medical data and exposure information in the DOE Data Center; investigation of health effects by tracking the medical history of workers and analyzing the possible effects of exposure; and providing technical support to the DOE Human Subject Protection Program, DOE Beryllium Registry, and Institutional Review Boards.

Specific tasks in support of these activities require ORISE to:

- 2.1.1 Provide technical assistance for illness and injury surveillance and in evaluation of worker health issues through:
 - 1) Data receipt, management, and quality assurance
 - 2) Report production
 - 3) Technical assistance to sites
 - 4) Assistance on special requests and reviews (quick response)
- **2.1.2** Provide technical assistance for DOE Human Subject Policy implementation through:
 - 1) Administrative assistance
 - 2) Distribution of information and guidance
 - 3) Identification and attainment of technical assistance
- 2.1.3 Maintaining the Human Subject Research Database, including:
 - Tracking data submission, requesting feedback, and conducting Internet postings
 - 2) Writing articles and giving presentations
 - 3) Coordinating research of ethical issues and new requirements
- **2.1.4** Facilitate electronic reporting of data for the DOE Beryllium Registry by:
 - 1) Collecting, checking, and reporting data condition
 - 2) Accepting, processing and loading data
- 2.1.5 Operation of Institutional Review Boards by:
 - 1) Arranging meetings and maintaining records and minutes
 - 2) Providing education to members
 - 3) Coordinating selection of new members as needed

- **2.1.6** Operation of a beryllium testing laboratory for performance of Lymphocyte Proliferation Tests to screen individuals for beryllium sensitivity through:
 - 1) Sample receipt, management, analysis, and disposal
 - 2) Data management and process quality assurance
 - 3) Communication of results
- 2.1.7 Operation of the Radiation Exposure Monitoring System through:
 - 1) Data receipt, management, and quality assurance
 - 2) Report production
 - Storage and maintenance of approximately 400,000 worker medical and exposure records in a facility meeting DOE's requirements for fire safety, security and confidentiality
- 2.2 <u>Independent environmental assessment and verification</u> Support decontamination and decommissioning of radioactively contaminated sites.

Conduct environmental characterization and independent verification of cleanup of radioactively contaminated sites, develop and disseminate analyses and remediation techniques throughout the DOE complex, and provide professional health physics, regulatory compliance, and technical program support.

Specific tasks in support of these activities require ORISE to:

- **2.2.1** Perform environmental radioactive characterization activities including:
 - 1) Field investigation
 - 2) Sampling and analysis
 - 3) Report preparation
- **2.2.2** Perform independent verification activities related to contamination elements described in the end point specifications for each project by:
 - 1) Providing all labor, equipment, subcontracting, and materials for verification activities
 - 2) Obtaining direct and indirect measurements for contamination including laboratory analysis
 - 3) Interpreting self-derived data and data submitted by the entity responsible for the cleanup of radioactively contaminated sites versus defined relative endpoints
 - 4) Developing a work plan, sample analysis plans, and reports (both interim and final)
 - 5) Submitting verification reports and identifying deficiencies in the activities performed by the entity responsible for cleanup of radioactively contaminated sites

- **2.2.3** Provide professional health physics, regulatory compliance, and technical program support by:
 - 1) Evaluating detection instrumentation for functionality
 - Assessing technical support documents, including "As Low As Reasonably Achievable" (ALARA) analysis and dose assessment information
- 2.3 <u>Radiation accident management</u> Provide expertise in the medical management of radiation accidents or incidents.

Operate the Radiation Emergency Assistance Center/Training Site (REAC/TS), a dedicated DOE facility located in Oak Ridge, Tennessee.

Specific tasks in support of this activity require ORISE to:

- **2.3.1** Provide a 24-hour response to calls for assistance for medical care of radiation accident victims by:
 - 1) Conducting medical and radiation triage, decontamination chelation therapy, assessment of injuries, and dose assessments
 - 2) Maintaining equipment to provide medical education, advice, and assistance
 - Providing technical continuing education courses in-house and off site to medical and health physics personnel
 - 4) Participating in the planning and conduct of emergency preparedness exercises and drills
 - 5) Evaluating new developments in chelation therapy
- **2.3.2** Provide programmatic clinical expertise and resources to:
 - Develop and implement techniques for clinical evaluation and treatment
 - 2) Maintain and improve REAC/TS Radiation Accident Registries
 - Maintain reporting to FDA for Investigational New Drug Applications
 - 4) Participate in occupational medicine meetings and symposia
- **2.3.3** Operate a Cytogenetics Biodosymetry Laboratory as a national resource for assessments of radiation dose exposures through:
 - 1) Providing dose estimates for radiation exposure events including multi/mass casualty events
 - Conducting collaborative research to improve the cytogenetic dose estimate methodology and its associated utility, and increasing the speed of analysis (through improved techniques, alternate methodologies, and automated equipment)

2.4 <u>National security and emergency management</u> – Support preparation and execution of DOE's emergency response assets.

Manage and conduct programs, studies, research, exercises, and/or training in areas such as radiological/nuclear incident management, emergency preparedness and response, and provide technical and programmatic assistance in addressing human behavior that impacts personnel security.

Specific tasks in support of these activities require ORISE to:

- **2.4.1** Support national security by providing technical and analytical support to radiological/nuclear incident management through:
 - 1) Development, conduct, and after action tracking of emergency response exercises
 - 2) Conduct of activities necessary to ensure that qualified technical and professional personnel, specialized equipment, and the readiness of Nuclear Incident Response Team (NIRT) capabilities are maintained (these activities are to be conducted primarily in Washington, DC)
- **2.4.2** Provide technical and analytical support for emergency management and response activities through:
 - 1) Review of emergency management directives, guidance, standards, and rulemaking
 - 2) Support of training and specialized emergency management studies
 - Technical and analytical support for development and implementation of evaluation criteria for emergency management programs
 - 4) Support for the development of Emergency Response Planning Guidelines and review of Acute Exposure Guidelines levels
 - 5) Support of development of biological guidelines
 - 6) Support of development of hazard assessments and consequence assessment toolboxes
 - 7) Support to the Oak Ridge Joint Information Center
- **2.4.3** Provide technical and programmatic support for the Center for Human Reliability Studies, a DOE Center for Excellence, through:
 - Research and development of position papers on issues affecting DOE's Human Reliability Program (HRP) and/or personnel security process
 - 2) Evaluation of HRP reporting criteria
 - 3) Revision of HRP refresher and briefing materials
 - 4) Serving as technical liaison with other similar agencies having human reliability programs

 Conduct of peer reviews of proposed research involving other governmental agencies

6) Assistance in early identification, assessment, intervention, referral, and follow-up of violence in the workplace

7) Performance of psychological evaluations, assessments, and requirements

8) Development of employee assistance and substance abuse programs and assessments

9) Evaluation of methodologies and intervention tools

2.5 <u>Professional and technical training</u> – Support DOE's operational commitment for protection of workers, the public, and the environment.

Manage, conduct, and develop hands-on laboratory-based training in the areas of health physics, medical health physics, environmental monitoring and radiological surveys in support of decommissioning. Manage and conduct studies and analyses to identify and assess the effectiveness of methods used to communicate information on health hazards. Develop training, public outreach, or educational materials that help DOE to inform stakeholders about the level of risk associated with specific hazards.

Specific tasks in support of these activities require ORISE to:

- **2.5.1** Conduct focus groups, surveys, interviews, and other activities that support formative research
- 2.5.2 Develop, implement, and evaluate health education and communication materials for specifically targeted audiences utilizing outreach documents, electronic media, and other communication tools
- **2.5.3** Assess training needs and resulting development, delivery, and evaluation of training programs and materials
- 2.5.4 Assist in activities for communicating health or crisis information, including development of communication plans, training, and moderation, organization, and development of proceedings for public meetings and stakeholder involvement activities.
- **2.5.5** Provide assistance to perform evaluations of projects and communication effectiveness
- 2.6 <u>Science education programs</u> Conduct workforce development programs to ensure availability of future scientists and engineers.

Manage scholarship, fellowship, internship, and research participation programs at the student, graduate, and faculty levels for research and training opportunities at DOE facilities in areas related to the mission of DOE.

2.6.1 ORISE will conduct and/or support these programs by:

1) Developing and implementing procedures for recruiting applicants, with emphasis on recruitment of participants who are under represented in science and technical fields

2) Preparing and distributing position and/or program announcements and conduct on-campus visits

3) Handling administrative activities related to selections, appointments, stipends, and travel reimbursements

- 4) Conducting associated activities complementary of research and training, such as the annual DOE Graduate Student Awards for the Lindau Meeting of Nobel Laureates and Students
- 2.6.2 In support of development of programs for the current and future workforce by academia and the Federal government, ORISE will also conduct labor trends research and provide follow-up studies to current science education. ORISE will collect, compile, and disseminate data.
- 2.7 <u>Scientific and technical resource integration</u> Facilitate collaboration between academia and DOE to advance scientific research and education, focus research efforts, and promote quality of DOE-funded research and other scientific and technical information.

Manage, coordinate, and conduct cooperative research jointly funded by DOE and universities or industry allowing university faculty, students, and industrial researchers to conduct research at and with the unique scientific facilities of DOE or others. Coordinate and conduct peer and merit reviews, ensuring an independent and objective evaluation process.

- 2.7.1 In supporting these activities, research will be conducted at Oak Ridge National Laboratory through the University Radioactive Ion Beam Consortium, which is organized within ORISE's administrative and fiscal structure. ORISE will also coordinate placement of scientists, faculty, and students in research programs at DOE national laboratories and facilities.
- **2.7.2** Technical assistance through peer and merit reviews will include the following:
 - 1) Coordination and conduct of peer and merit reviews and other technical activities of: (a) grant applications and proposals; (b) ongoing research, scientific, and technical projects and

programs; and (c) other scientific and technical information including assessments, reports, and studies

2) Identification of experts within academic, private, and national laboratory communities and maintenance of databases of such

3) Collection and documentation of comments and recommendations and development of reports

4) Coordination of mission-related workshops, committee activities, program reviews, meeting summaries, and reports

5) Implementation of process improvements and other review related assistance as required

The Proposal Evaluation and Electronic Review (PeerNet) software, copyrighted by ORISE, provides a standardized model to support these activities.

RECITALS

- (a) On the effective date of January 1, 2006, DOE and ORAU, the Contractor, entered into Agreement(s) No. DE-AC05-00OR23100, or a Supplemental Agreement(s) thereto, providing for the transfer of funds on a payments-cleared basis.
- (b) DOE requires that amounts transferred to the Contractor thereunder be deposited in a special demand deposit account at a financial institution covered by Department of the Treasury-approved Government deposit insurance organizations that are identified in I TFM 6-9000 (see Fig. IX-10).

These special demand deposits must be kept separate from the Contractor's general or other funds, and the parties are agreeable to so depositing said amounts with the Financial Institution.

- (c) The special demand deposit accounts shall be designated as follows:

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COVENANTS

In consideration of the foregoing, and for other good and valuable considerations, it is agreed that---

- (1) The Government shall have a title to the credit balance in said account to secure the repayment of all funds transferred to the Contractor, and said title shall be superior to any lien, title, or claim of the Financial Institution or others with respect to such accounts.
- (2) The Financial Institution shall be bound by the provisions of said Agreement(s) between DOE and the Contractor relating to the transfer of funds into and withdrawal of funds from the above special demand deposit account, which are hereby incorporated into this Agreement by reference, but the Financial Institution shall not be responsible for the application of funds withdrawn from said account. After receipt by the Financial Institution of directions from DOE, the Financial Institution shall act thereon and shall be under no liability to any party hereto for any action taken in accordance with the said written directions. Any written directions received by the Financial Institution from the Government upon DOE Stationery and purporting to be signed by, or signed at the written direction of, the Government may, insofar as the rights, duties, and liabilities of the Financial Institution are concerned, be considered as having been properly issued and filed with the Financial Institution by DOE.
- (3) DOE, or its authorized representatives, shall have access to financial records maintained by the Financial Institution with respect to special demand deposit account at all reasonable times and for all reasonable purposes, including, but without limitation to, the inspection or copying of such financial records and any or all memoranda, checks, payment requests, correspondence, or documents pertaining thereto. Such financial records shall be preserved by the Financial Institution for a period of 6 years after the final payment under the Agreement.
- (4) In the event of the service of any writ of attachments, levy of execution, or commencement of garnishment proceedings with respect to the special demand deposit account, the Financial Institution shall promptly notify DOE at-

(5) DOE shall authorize funds that shall remain available to the extent that obligations have been incurred in good faith thereunder by the Contractor to the Financial Institution for the benefit of the special demand deposit account. The Financial Institution agrees to honor upon presentation for payment all payments issued by the Contractor and to restrict all withdrawals against the funds authorized to an amount sufficient to maintain the average daily balance in the special demand deposit account in a net positive and as close to zero as administratively possible.

If documentation furnished by the Financial Institution demonstrates that this withdrawal procedure would be inequitable to DOE or to the Financial Institution Covenant 5 may be modified upon agreement of all parties concerned. The Financial Institution shall comply with the provisions contained in I TFM 6-2000,

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which states that payment vouchers (TFS form 5808) ordinarily should not be drawn more frequently than daily or for amounts less than \$5,000 and in no case should they be drawn for more than \$50,000,000 unless otherwise stated in the Letter of Credit. In the event that the balance remaining in the Letter of Credit limitation is not sufficient to cover the checks presented, the Department of the Treasury will, at the specific authorization of DOE, instruct the Federal Reserve Bank to immediately wire a transfer of funds from the Department of the Treasury account to the Financial Institution's account, for the benefit of the Contractor's special demand deposit account, in an amount sufficient to cover the check presented in excess of the available Letter of Credit.

The Financial Institution agrees to service the account in this manner based on the requirements and specifications contained in ORAU solicitation No. 06-12770 dated May 15, 2006. The Financial Institution agrees that per-item costs, detailed in the form "Schedule of Financial Institution Processing Charges," contained in the Financial Institution's aforesaid bid will remain constant during the term of this Agreement. The Financial Institution shall calculate the monthly fees based on services rendered and invoice the contractor. The contractor shall issue a check or automated clearing house authorization transfer to the Financial Institution in payment thereof.

- (6) The Financial Institution shall post collateral, acceptable under Department of the Treasury Title 31 CFR 202 / Treasury Financial Manual Part 6, Chapter 9000, with the Federal Reserve Bank in an amount equal to the net balances in all of the accounts included in the Agreement, less the Department of the Treasury-approved deposit insurance.
- (7) This Agreement, with all its provisions and covenants, shall be in effect for a term of 5 years, beginning on the 1st day of July, 2006, and ending on the 30th day of June, 2011. The total duration of this contract shall not exceed five (5) years.
- (8) DOE, the Contractor, or the Financial Institution may terminate this Agreement at any time within the agreement period upon submitting written notification to the other parties 90 days prior to the desired termination date. The specific provisions for operating the account during this 90-day period are contained in Covenant 11.
- (9) DOE or the Contractor may terminate this Agreement at any time upon 30 days' written notice to the Financial Institution if DOE or the Contractor, or both parties, find that the Financial Institution has failed to substantially perform its obligations under this Agreement or that the Financial Institution is performing its obligations in a manner that precludes administering the program in an effective and efficient manner or that precludes the effective utilization of the Government's cash resources.
- (10) Notwithstanding the provisions of Covenants 8 and 9, in the event that the Agreement, referenced in Recital (a), between DOE and the Contractor is not renewed or is terminated, this Agreement between DOE, the Contractor, and the Financial Institution shall be terminated automatically upon the delivery of written notice to the Financial Institution.
- (11) In the event of termination, the Financial Institution agrees to retain the Contractor's special demand deposit account for an additional 90-day period to clear outstanding payment items. During this 90-day period, DOE shall place on deposit in that account sufficient funds to cover all outstanding checks presented for payment.

During the 90-day period, it is further understood that:

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- (a) The Financial Institution shall maintain collateral in an amount sufficient to collateralize the highest balance in the account, less Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) coverage on the accounts, and that no cost of such collateralization shall accrue to the Contractor or DOE.
- (b) All service charges shall be consistent with the amounts reflected in this Agreement as identified in Schedule of Financial Institution Processing Charges.
- (c) No charge will be made for any FDIC or other depository insurance assessed.
- (d) All terms and conditions of the Financial Institution's proposal dated June 7, 2006 which are not inconsistent with this 90-day additional term shall remain in effect.
- (e) This Agreement shall continue in effect for the 90-day additional period, with exception for the following:
 - 1. Letter of Credit (Covenant 5)
 - 2. Term Agreement (Covenant 7)
 - 3. Termination of Agreement (Covenants 8 and 9)
