- Fire officials are encouraging area residents to spend their weekends on public lands, but to leave your fireworks at home.
- Fireworks are **NOT** allowed on any federal nor state lands in the State of Utah.
- These photos are from a fireworks demonstration that was done the week before the 24th of July. A legal firework started the field on fire. As you can see in the photos, it will only take a spark to start a wildfire.
- The small house in the field was representative of a home in the Wildland Urban Interface. Create defensible space around your home. Keep it lean, clean and green.
- Individuals responsible for starting a wildfire on public lands may be held responsible for the cost of putting it out.



These are some illegal fireworks that have been confiscated in Utah. Please abide by local firework restrictions, read firework labels, and be extra careful. It will only take a spark to start a wildfire.
