

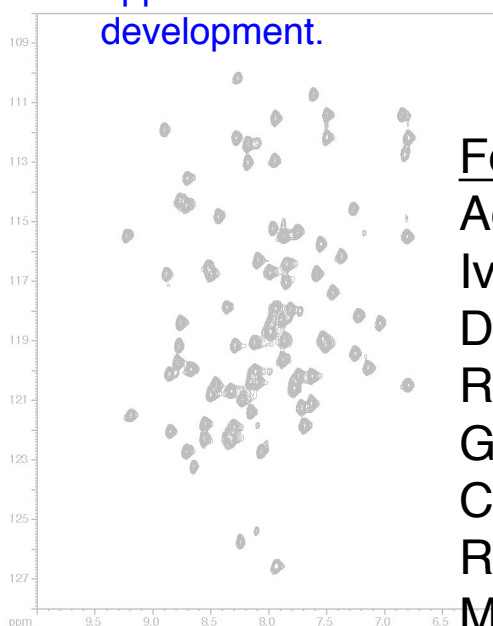
# Forty Years of NMR in Biological Systems

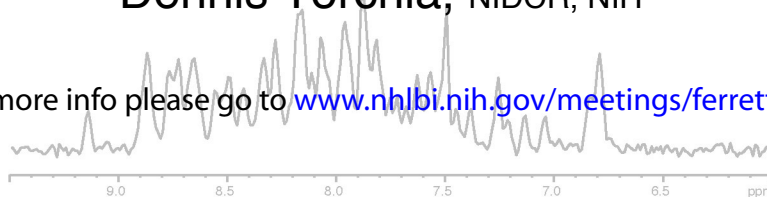
