Background

- Department of Commerce initiative to reduce program costs for small/medium manufacturers (SMMs)
- FTZ Staff directed to benchmark U.S. program with similar programs and procedures abroad
- Researched programs in 77 countries
- Main finding: Some countries provide SMMs with quicker and simpler access to zone procedures







Manufacturing Proposals

- FTZ Staff drafted two proposals to enhance access and reduce program costs for SMMs:
 - 1) Delegate authority to Executive Secretary to approve certain temporary/interim manufacturing
 - 2) Enhance pre-application process through:
 - Expanded counseling for SMMs
 - Availability of sample applications
 - Issuing simplified guidelines/formats



Temporary/Interim Manufacturing (T/IM) Authority



- FTZ Board delegates authority to Executive Secretary to approve T/IM cases in certain circumstances
- Applies to any FTZ space (zone or subzone) already existing at time T/IM application is submitted
- T/IM authority for up to two years; non-renewable
- Can make application for permanent authority during T/IM period (incl. simultaneous with T/IM application)







Implementation of T/IM Authority

- FTZ Staff analyzed public comments and other factors, recommended specific approach to implementation
- FTZ Board adopted staff's recommendations (report available on web site: www.trade.gov/ftz)
- Goals for T/IM case processing:
 - 15-day pre-docketing period
 - 75-day processing period from docketing
- Threshold (pre-filing) requirement to show "eligibility"





Eligibility for T/IM Consideration

- Eligibility based on database of <u>select</u> inputs and finished products from preceding five years' cases
- T/IM applications limited to 20 inputs, 10 inverted tariffs, and 5 finished products from database
- Domestic T/IM applications use:
 - six-digit HTSUS specificity
 - input-finished product <u>combinations</u> in database
- Export-only T/IM applications use four-digit HTSUS specificity







T/IM Database

- Criteria for inclusion of prior approvals in database:
 - Application contained detailed (six-digit) HTSUS information
 - Items published for comment in Federal Register
 - Inputs, finished products were a focus of FTZ
 Staff's analysis (i.e., part of "primary" scope)
- Database of eligible inputs and finished products available on FTZ Board web site: www.trade.gov/ftz








T/IM Database Look-ups

- Database can be <u>searched</u> by:
 - Finished product (using six-digit HTSUS)
 - Component (using six-digit HTSUS)
- Database can be <u>browsed</u> by:
 - Finished product
 - Component (scheduled availability -- late 2004)


FTZ MANUFACTURING DATABASE

- 2) a six-digit HTSUS number for a finished product







T/IM Application Form

- Fill-in form used for all T/IM cases
- Separate sections for:
 - General information
 - T/IM scope
 - Permanent scope (if applicable)
 - Company and industry information
- Same form can be used for concurrent or subsequent application for permanent authority







T/IM Case Processing

- Application to be submitted must include:
 - Cover letter from grantee
 - Completed application form
 - Concurrence letter from local Customs
- 30-day public comment period on T/IM applications
- FTZ Staff consults with Department of Commerce industry experts during processing period





What about new subzones?

- New subzone cases cannot be processed on the same 75-day track as T/IM cases because:
 - FTZ Act requires subzones to be processed in same way as new zone cases
 - Any case involving new sites also requires full inter-agency concurrence due to security and resource considerations
- FTZ Staff will try to expedite subzone cases where directly impacted by a competitor's T/IM approval







FTZ Board Outreach on T/IM

- Work with FTZ community (esp. grantees) to explain details and benefits of T/IM procedure
- Overhaul and simplify FTZ Board web site to enhance accessibility for potential SMM (and esp. T/IM) users
- Work with U.S. Commercial Service offices, industry associations, etc., to increase awareness of FTZ program and T/IM procedure
