Subject: Reclamation Standard Water-Related Contract Articles, Article 22: Water

Conservation

Purpose: To commit Reclamation's Standard Contract Article 22 to the

Reclamation Manual, introduced by a brief description and direction regarding its use, for the benefit of making it easily accessible and promoting Reclamation-wide consistency in its use and content.

1. **Water Conservation.** This article reflects the requirement under the Reclamation Reform Act of 1982 (RRA) that any contractor entering into a repayment or water service contract executed pursuant to Reclamation law or the Water Supply Act (43 U.S.C. § 890b) develop a water conservation plan according to RRA § 210(b). The charts included in Reclamation Manual Policy PEC P10 specify which contract types require standard article 22.

2. Reclamation Standard Contract Article 22.

WATER CONSERVATION¹

Prior to the delivery of water provided from or conveyed through federally constructed or federally financed facilities pursuant to this contract, the Contractor shall develop a water conservation plan, as required by Section 210(b) of the Reclamation Reform Act of 1982 (RRA) and Part 427.1 of the Water Conservation Rules and Regulations effective January, 1, 1998.²

²This article replaces the Amendatory Municipal and Industrial Water Service Contracts Water Conservation Article. Districts meeting the exception requirements detailed in the Reclamation Manual Directive and Standard, *Administering Water Conservation Plans Pursuant to Statutory and Contractual Requirements*, WTR 01-01, dated January 17, 2003, are exempted from preparing a water conservation plan under the RRA.
