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The U. S. Department of Commerce announced today that total sales of retail stores in June were estimated at \$22.2 billion. Statistics prepared by the Department's Bureau of the Census show that this advance figure, after adjustment for seasonal variations and trading day differences, but not for price changes, was about 6 percent above June 1963 but virtually unchanged from the May 1964 level.

The Office of Business Economics noted that after adjustment, durable goods sales were down 3 percent from May to June, attributable primarily to a decline in automotive dealer sales from the high May rate. Nondurable goods sales rose 2 percent in June. Based on the full sample, seasonally adjusted sales of all retail stores rose 2 percent in May to a new record.

The June sales figures are based on a monthly survey of the Bureau of the Census conducted in cooperation with a representative cross-section of about 2,500 retail firms which, in total, operate some 48,000 stores in the United States. The firms which are cooperating in the early reporting of sales are part of a larger sample group which furnishes figures at a later date. The advance estimates are subject to revision by the estimates subsequently derived from the full sample.

The revision of the total seldom exceeds 1.5 percent and for the past year has averaged 0.7 percent. For individual kind-of-business groups, revisions have been greater, ranging on the average from 0.7 percent for the food group to 3.4 percent for the lumber, building, hardware, farm equipment group.
