THIS QUESTIONNAIRE WILL BE ADMINISTERED USING COMPUTER ASSISTED TELEPHONE INTERVIEW TECHNOLOGY. THE INTERVIEWER WILL READ THE QUESTIONS ALOUD AND TYPE RESPONSES TO THE QUESTIONS INTO THE COMPUTER. THE INTERVIEW PROGRAM WILL 1) DISPLAY THE CORRECT TENSE OF VERBS, 2) PROVIDE ALTERNATE ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS (E.G., NOT APPLICABLE, "I DON'T KNOW"), 3) NAVIGATE COMPLEX SKIP PATTERNS, AND 4) PERFORM OTHER USEFUL FUNCTIONS. I am most interested in what is <u>required</u> by the district, not what is recommended or contained in non-binding guidance documents, unless the question specifically asks about recommendations.
- 3. If a district policy is worded in such a way that it requires schools to develop and adopt their own policies on a given topic, for the purpose of this questionnaire please consider it the same as a district-wide requirement.
- 4. I recognize that the district may sometimes grant policy exceptions or waivers, but please answer each question based on what is considered the general policy and standard practice.
- 5. Please do not consider school practices or policies when answering the questions. We will ask about school practices and policies when we collect information from schools across the country.

### **Provision of Services**

The following questions ask about standard mental health and social services, such as crisis intervention, alcohol or other drug use treatment, or identification of emotional disorders, offered to all students at a school. These services usually are provided by a school counselor, psychologist, or social worker but also could be provided at the school by staff from collaborating community agencies.

Student assistance programs provide services designed to assist students experiencing personal or social problems that can impact school performance, physical health, or overall well-being.
