## NOAA PUBLISHES FINAL LISTING OF WEST COAST STEELHEAD

Ten Distinct Population Segments Established

NOAA Fisheries Service issued a final listing in today's Federal Register recognizing ten unique populations, or Distinct Population Segments (DPSs), of West Coast steelhead as either threatened or endangered under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). This listing was finalized after receiving public comments on proposed regulations initially published on June 14, 2004.

South-Central California Coast Steelhead DPS – Threatened

Upper Willamette River Steelhead DPS – Threatened

Lower Columbia River Steelhead DPS - Threatened

Middle Columbia River Steelhead DPS – Threatened

Upper Columbia River Steelhead DPS – Threatened

Snake River Basin Steelhead DPS – Threatened

The listing of steelhead is similar to that in the June 2004 proposed regulation although nomenclature, clarifications and area descriptions were modified as a result of public comment that was extended in June 2005 and then re-opened again for comment in November 2005.

One change brought about by these comments is the application by NOAA Fisheries Service of the DPS policy to delineate steelhead populations rather than the Evolutionarily Significant Unit policy. The change is also consistent with Fish and Wildlife Service's approach to making listing determinations.
