NEWS RELEASE SUMMARY - September 19, 2008

United States Attorney Karen P. Hewitt announced that William Joseph Bean, II, was sentenced today in federal court in San Diego by United States District Court Judge Barry Ted Moskowitz to serve 34 months in custody, based upon Bean's conviction for one count of possession of child pornography, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252(a)(4)(B). Judge Moskowitz also ordered that Bean serve a ten-year term of supervised release following his release from prison and required Bean to register as a sex offender. Bean tendered a guilty plea on May 6, 2008.

According to the court records, Bean admitted that on January 2, 2008, he possessed a computer which contained over 600 images of minors, some as young as five years old, engaging in sexually explicit conduct. He also admitted to posting various images of child pornography on Yahoo! At the time of his arrest, he was downloading over 600 files of child pornography onto his computer.

Previously, Bean had been employed as a summer camp counselor for children.

This case stems from an investigation by the San Diego Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force,

whose members include the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Immigration and Customs Enforcement, the

San Diego Police Department, the San Diego County Sheriff's Department, the Chula Vista Police

Department, the United States Attorney's Office, the San Diego District Attorney's Office, the United States

Postal Inspection Service, the Naval Criminal Investigative Service, the United States Marshals Service, the

Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory, the Defense Criminal Investigative Service, and the El Cajon

Police Department.

This case is being brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative designed to

protect children from online exploitation and abuse. Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local

resources to better locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well
