Abstract:: Usual and customary business records relating to wine are routinely inspected by ATF officers to ensure the payment of alcohol taxes due to the Federal Government. The record retention period for this information collection is 3 years.

Current Actions: The only change to this information collection is an increase in burden hours due to an increase in the number of wine premises.

Type of Review: Extension.

Affected Public: Business or other for-profit.

Estimated Number of Respondents: 3,131.

Estimated Total Annual Burden Hours: 313.
