I received the amendment in response to dr. sheridan's comments for 13472A. i have one question about the omission of the pregnancy testing.

Formerly your consent forms stated pregnancy testing was to occur in children. now it has been removed because "study subjects are in early puberty and not sexually mature". However, your grant states that admission procedures in the CRC include a "urine pregnancy test" on "pubertal or post-menarcheal females".

Can you please clarify why there is a discrepancy between the grant and the information in this amendment.

If you have decided to revise your protocol to exclude the pubertal or post-menarcheal females, you will need to submit a revised protocol indicating this change.
