## <u>Food Pathways – Building Production and Marketing Capacity</u> <u>for Limited Resource Farmers a partnership training with USDA</u> <u>Risk Management Agency: Outreach</u>

This 2-day workshop will provide farmers and ranchers with the hands on training to build fertility systems for use in extended season production and whole farm fertility.

### **Workshop Focus Areas:**



- Composting and Vermicomposting
- Extended season production using hoop green houses and raised beds (unheated, low cost setup)
- Post harvest handling and distribution
- Production and marketing scheduling and planning meeting (Monday, September 26) for farmers and cooperatives interested in selling product to RFC

The goal of the workshop is to enable more southern producers to grow "off-season" crops for northern markets (Chicago, IL and Milwaukee, WI). The training will be followed with a production schedule and logistics meeting for farmers, cooperative leaders and outreach educators interested in selling products to the Rainbow Farmers 'Cooperative for the 2006 season and beyond. A representative from a trucking firm will be present to discuss product pick-ups and related logistics.
