


Honolulu County, Hawaii Population and Housing Narrative Profile: 2004

POPULATION OF Honolulu County: In 2004, Honolulu County had a household population of 869,000 - 441,000 (51 percent) females and 428,000 (49 percent) males. The median age was 37.9 years. Twenty-four percent of the population were under 18 years and 14 percent were 65 years and older.


For people reporting one race alone, 25 percent were White; 3 percent were Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 60 percent were Asian; 10 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent were Some other race. Eighteen percent reported Two or more races. Seven percent of the people in Honolulu County were Hispanic. Nineteen percent of the people in Honolulu County were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2004 there were 300,000 households in Honolulu County. The average household size was 2.9 people.

Families made up 70 percent of the households in Honolulu County. This figure includes both married-couple families (54 percent) and other families (16 percent). Nonfamily households made up 30 percent of all households in Honolulu County. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were comprised of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.


NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Twenty percent of the people living in Honolulu County in 2004 were foreign born. Eighty percent were native, including 56 percent who were born in Hawaii.

Among people at least five years old living in Honolulu County in 2004, 27 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 4 percent spoke Spanish and 96 percent spoke some other language; 46 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2004, 86 percent of the people at least one year old living in Honolulu County were living in the same residence one year earlier; 9 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, 3 percent from another state, and 1 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Honolulu County, Hawaii in 2004



EDUCATION: In 2004, 88 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 31 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Among people 16 to 19 years old, 2 percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Honolulu County was 225,000 in 2004. Preprimary school enrollment was 25,000 and elementary or high school enrollment was 138,000 children. College enrollment was 62,000.



The Educational Attainment of People in Honolulu County, Hawaii in 2004



DISABILITY: In Honolulu County, among people at least five years old in 2004, 12 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 5 percent of people 5 to 20 years old, to 9 percent of people 21 to 64 years old, and to 35 percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2004, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Honolulu County were Educational, health, and social services, 21 percent, and Other services (execpt public administration), 14 percent.

OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 36 percent; Sales and office occupations, 28 percent; Service occupations, 19 percent; Construction, extraction, and maintenance occupations, 8 percent; and Production, transporation, and material moving occupations, 8 percent. Sixty-one percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 23 percent were Federal, state, or local government workers; and 7 percent were Self-employed.


TRAVEL TO WORK: Sixty-six percent of Honolulu County workers drove to work alone in 2004, 17 percent carpooled, 8 percent took public transportation, and 6 percent used other means. The remaining 3 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 27.6 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Honolulu County was \$55,624. Eighty-two percent of the households received earnings and 25 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$13,253. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2004, 9 percent of people were in poverty. Eleven percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 9 percent of people 65 years old and over. Seven percent of all families and 20 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.


Poverty Rates in Honolulu County, Hawaii in 2004

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2004, Honolulu County had a total of 326,000 housing units, 8 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 52 percent were in single-unit structures, 47 percent were in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent were mobile homes. Seventeen percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

The Types of Housing Units in Honolulu County, Hawaii in 2004





occupied housing units - 172,000 (57 percent) owner occupied and 128,000 (43 percent) renter occupied. Five percent of the households did not have telephone service and 12 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Thirty-five percent had two vehicles and another 18 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,711, nonmortgaged owners \$312, and renters \$874. Thirty-six percent of owners with mortgages, 7 percent of owners without mortgages, and 48 percent of renters in Honolulu County spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
