Dear Mr. Walker:

We are writing to request that GAO study the problem of sex offenders living in nursing homes and prisoners paroled to nursing homes.

In recent months, we have read disturbing news accounts about these dangerous individuals being housed with frail senior citizens in nursing homes, in some cases resulting in physical and sexual abuse. Often, family members, nursing home staff, and state departments of health are not even aware that these placements of sex offenders and prisoners are occurring.

Given the large amount of federal funds that nursing homes receive through the Medicare and Medicaid programs, there is a strong federal interest in protecting the health and safety of nursing home residents. To help us determine whether additional federal oversight is necessary, we request that GAO study the following issues:

- (1) The prevalence of sex offenders and prisoners being placed in or paroled to nursing homes in California, Oklahoma, and Minnesota, as well as in other parts of the country;
- (2) The prevalence of physical and sexual abuse caused by sex offenders and prisoners in nursing homes;
- (3) Whether nursing home staff members and family members of nursing home residents are given sufficient notice about placements of sex offenders and prisoners;
- (4) Whether sex offenders and prisoners are being appropriately supervised and/or segregated from other nursing home residents; and
