Ethics Bill—Agreement: A unanimous consent-agreement was reached providing that at 11 a.m., on Tuesday, January 9, 2007, the Senate begin consideration of S. 1, to provide greater transparency in the legislative process, for debate only, and that the time until 2:15 p.m. be equally divided between the Ma-
