Ex-US football star killed in Afghanistan-official

WASHINGTON, April 23 (Reuters) - Former U.S. professional football star Pat Tillman, who gave up a \$3.6 million sports contract to join the military's elite special forces, has been killed in a firefight in Afghanistan, a U.S. official said on Friday.

The official, who asked not to be identified, said Tillman was killed on Thursday. The 27-year-old soldier abruptly quit his National Football League career following the 2002 season and joined the Army a year after the attacks on America.

Enlisting with his brother Kevin in the wake of the Sept. 11 attacks on the Pentagon and World Trade Center, Tillman turned down a \$3.6 million contract from the Arizona Cardinals to become an Army Ranger for an annual salary of \$18,000.

The 5-foot-11 (1.8 metre), 200-pound (91-kg) Tillman played for five seasons with the Cardinals from 1998 to 2002.

He was selected by Arizona with the 226th pick of the 1998 draft -- the league only selects 241 players - but the Arizona State University star emerged from training camp as the Cardinals' starting strong safety on defense.

WASHINGTON (AP) _ Pat Tillman, who walked away from his professional football career to join the Army Rangers, was killed in Afghanistan, .S. officials said Friday.

The officials, who spoke on the condition of anonymity, said a formal announcement was expected later in the day.

Spokesmen at the Pentagon and U.S. Army declined comment. There were no immediate details on his death.

A military official, also speaking on the condition of

anonymity, said that a soldier had been killed in action in Afghanistan Thursday, but could not confirm that the soldier was Tillman.

Some members of the Army's elite Ranger units were taking part in the hunt for al-Qaida and Taliban fighters in southeastern Afghanistan, the military official said.

Tillman played four seasons with the National Football League's Arizona Cardinals before enlisting in the Army in May 2002. The safety turned down a three-year, \$3.6 million deal from Arizona.

His brother, Kevin, a former minor league baseball prospect in the Cleveland Indians' organization, also joined the Rangers and served in the Middle East.
