AMENDMENT TO H.R. 6003, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. LYNCH OF MASSACHUSETTS

In title II, add at the end the following new section
(and amend the table of contents accordingly):

1 **SEC. 225. AMTRAK INSPECTOR GENERAL SECURITY TRAIN-**
2 **ING REVIEW.**

3 The Amtrak Inspector General shall conduct a review
4 regarding the current state of security training being pro-
5 vided to frontline Amtrak employees, including Amtrak se-
6 curity personnel, dispatchers, locomotive engineers, con-
7 ductors, trainmen, and any other employees that the Am-
8 trak Inspector General determines should be considered
9 as frontline Amtrak employees. The review conducted by
10 the Amtrak Inspector General shall specifically include an
11 examination of the extent to which frontline Amtrak em-
12 ployees are currently receiving training regarding the fol-
13 lowing:

14 (1) A determination of the seriousness of any
15 occurrence or threat.

16 (2) Crew and passenger communication and co-
17 ordination.

18 (3) Emergency evacuation procedures for Am-
19 trak passengers and employees.

1 (4) Hazardous material recognition, storage,
2 transport, and monitoring.

3 (5) Operation and maintenance of security
4 equipment and systems.

5 (6) Appropriate responses to defend or protect
6 oneself.

7 (7) The use of protective equipment.

8 (8) Terrorist psychology, behavior, and meth-
9 ods.

10 (9) Live situational exercises concerning various
11 emergency scenarios, including terrorist attacks, nat-
12 ural disasters, and hazardous material explosions.

13 (10) Unauthorized rail yard and locomotive cab
14 access.

15 (11) Any other area the Amtrak Inspector Gen-
16 eral considers appropriate.

17 Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment of this
18 Act, the Amtrak Inspector General shall transmit a report
19 containing the results of the review conducted under this
20 section to the Committees on Transportation and Infra-
21 structure and Homeland Security of the House of Rep-
22 resentatives and the Committees on Commerce, Science,
23 and Transportation and Homeland Security and Govern-
24 mental Affairs of the Senate. The report shall also include
25 any recommendations that the Amtrak Inspector General

1 may have regarding improvements to the security training
2 currently received by frontline Amtrak employees that
3 could be immediately implemented as Amtrak awaits the
4 issuance of the security training regulations for frontline
5 railroad employees by the Department of Homeland Security
6 mandated by section 1517(a) of the Implementing
7 Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007 (6
8 U.S.C. 1167(a)).
