Dear Administrator Leavitt:

On February 2, 2004, California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and the California Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) submitted a request for a waiver of the 2 percent oxygenate mandate for California's gasoline. We urge your swift approval of this request.

A Federal waiver is crucial to California's ability to improve its ground water and air quality through the use of reformulated gasoline. As the EPA's Blue Ribbon Panel on Oxygenate in Gasoline reported on September 15, 1999, "within California, lifting the oxygenate requirement will result in greater flexibility to maintain and enhance emission reductions, particularly as California pursues new formulation requirements for gasoline."

As a former governor, you recognize the importance of allowing states the flexibility to meet Federal policy goals. EPA's approval of California's waiver request will not only help California protect the environment, but will also allow California refiners the flexibility to produce more cost-effective gasoline formulations, saving our consumers money at the pump.

California has long led the nation in efforts to reduce air pollution and would like to continue to do so. We look forward to your prompt response, and the provision of a schedule for your agency's decision on the waiver.
